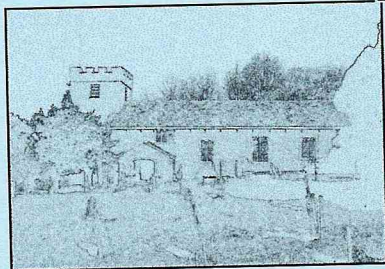

THE GOLDEN THREAD

Everything that we have in life is a gift. The relationships that we enjoy, the food that we eat, our bodies and our health – in fact the very air that we breathe – they are all gifts.

The idea that everything in life is a gift suggests, of course, a giver; there is no gift without a giver. For Christians the belief in a loving God, who is both our Creator and Sustainer, makes this idea and that of a Giver fairly straightforward. For non-believers this is sometimes less so. However, whether or not the idea of life as a series of gifts given by a Giver is part of our experience or not, the opposite – loss – is the common experience of believer and non-believer alike. In any life there is the experience of loss of employment through redundancy or retirement; there is the loss of health and capability through ill-health and ageing; there is the loss of friends and loved ones through death; and we even lose our own bodies at the point of our own death – nothing appears to remain, all is lost and taken away from us.

When I look at my own life, I see these many threads of my life; the more colourful ones of success, happiness and contentment, and the darker tones of failure, sadness and bereavement. And yet, when I look at my life, I see another thread there that is distinct from the others, sometimes slightly hidden and at other times bright and bold.

The Apostle John had a vision of heaven where he saw the risen Lord Jesus and he wrote:

"When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he placed his right hand on me, saying, 'Do not be afraid; I am the first and the last, and the living one. I was dead, and see, I am alive for ever and ever; and I have the keys of Death and of Hades'"

This other thread in my life is the Golden Thread, the thread that is always there. It is the relationship that I have with God the Father, my Creator and Sustainer; it is the relationship that is possible through the reconciliation of God the Son, the Lord Jesus; and it is the relationship that is given fresh life through God the Holy Spirit. And this thread is different from the other threads. The other threads come to an end, even the thread of my own life will come to an end – they all come to an end and all of them will be taken from me. But the Golden Thread continues to my death, through my death and beyond. The Golden Thread never ends because my relationship with God will never come to an end – when all else is lost and taken away, He remains *"the first and the last, and the living one"*.

Getting to know Jesus better

From Mark chapter 6 - New Living Translation of the Bible
Notes are by Matt Rich

30 The apostles returned to Jesus from their ministry tour and told him all they had done and taught. 31 Then Jesus said, "Let's go off by ourselves to a quiet place and rest awhile." He said this because there were so many people coming and going that Jesus and his apostles didn't even have time to eat.

Jesus is not only interested in the spiritual, He is also interested in our physical needs. He understands what it is to be a human, to be tired, to feel weary, to need a rest, a break. Jesus doesn't look down on us because we need these things. Here it is His suggestion that they all took some time out, to have a break from the good things they were doing.

32 So they left by boat for a quiet place, where they could be alone. 33 But many people recognised them and saw them leaving, and people from many towns ran ahead along the shore and got there ahead of them. 34 Jesus saw the huge crowd as he stepped from the boat, and he had compassion on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things.

Jesus had compassion on them because they didn't have anyone to show them the way, they were lost and confused without direction in their lives. Jesus wanted to help them to know which way to go in life.

35 Late in the afternoon his disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. 36 Send the crowds away so they can go to the nearby farms and villages and buy something to eat." 37 But Jesus said, "You feed them."

Jesus liked to stretch the faith of those who follow Him - what will they do? Jesus likes to challenge us too!

"With what?" they asked. "We'd have to work for months to earn enough money to buy food for all these people!"

The disciples could still only see things in practical, physical ways - even though they had just experienced God doing miracles through them when they went out in twos. It is very easy for us to keep focusing back on what we know is practically achievable, but Jesus wants us to trust Him more and understand that with Him, anything is possible!

38 "How much bread do you have?" he asked. "Go and find out." They came back and reported, "We have five loaves of bread and two fish." 39 Then Jesus told the disciples to have the people sit down in groups on the green grass. 40 So they sat down in groups of fifty or a hundred. 41 Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, looked up toward heaven, and blessed them. Then, breaking the loaves into pieces, he kept giving the bread to the disciples so they could distribute it to the people. He also divided the fish for everyone to share. 42 They all ate as much as they wanted, 43 and afterward, the disciples picked up twelve baskets of leftover bread and fish. 44 A total of 5,000 men and their families were fed from those loaves!

Jesus can take the small that we have to offer Him and use us to do so much more than we could ever imagine - but it begins with us being willing to offer it to Him and then working with Him as He works through us. None of us has too little to offer, no matter how big the thing in front of us that needs to be done.

45 Immediately after this, Jesus insisted that his disciples get back into the boat and head across the lake to Bethsaida, while he sent the people home. 46 After telling everyone good-bye, he went up into the hills by himself to pray.

Making time away from people and the business of the day to talk to God is so important, it is not a luxury extra, it is part of what we were created to do.

These articles, looking at Jesus through the book of Mark, are included each month to help us learn, straight from the Bible, what Jesus is really like.

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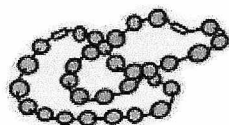


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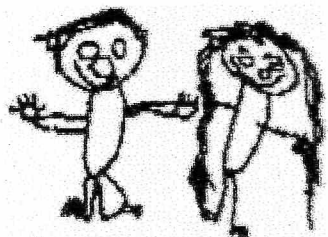
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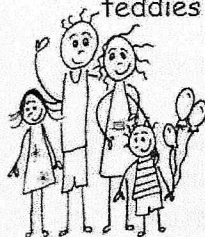


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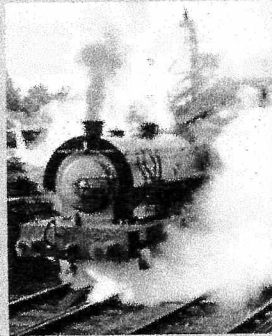
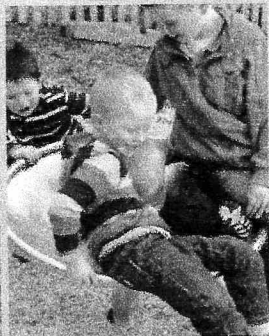
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GOD FOR ALL



Hopefully you will soon be hearing MUCH more about **God for All**. It was launched just recently and the words sums up what churches across Cumbria have been working on for the last few years - our emphasis and priority to help more people connect with God, and help Christians go on in their faith, their care and service, their worship and witness.

The Methodist, Anglican and United Reformed Church in Cumbria have developed a series of focussed plans and strategies to support this

shared commitment - strategies for our buildings, for outreach and for ministry. Each of these in different ways is designed to put mission at the heart of what we do - sharing in God's work in this world and building for his Kingdom. We have now reached a defining point - a point at which the interlinking strands can be pulled together in one all-embracing vision. Instead of endlessly talking about this we are now going to get on with it and make it happen.

God for All encapsulates what we are about. We want everyone in Cumbria, residents and visitors, to have the opportunity to discover more of God and God's purpose for their lives. We will encourage churches to be vibrant and loving communities, working together, serving and worshipping God, and making God known. It is sometimes too easy to think that 'church' exists for its members. We exist partly for ourselves, but mainly for the benefit of others - so that others may experience and discover the love and truth of God.

A new website has been launched to help people get to grips with this. www.godforall.org.uk is designed for people in churches to see what is happening and being planned. If you go there you can easily view a four minute talk by me (!) that explains why and how this is happening, and how it fits into the renewal of our church life, and the development of mission communities, and our emphasis on growing disciples and growing together as Christians. Churches across Cumbria have received leaflets and posters giving more detail about this.

The leaflet offers a **God for All** prayer - a prayer we invite individuals and churches to use regularly and make their own. Here is that prayer. I commend **God for All** to you, and encourage you to get involved in these different ways of strengthening the life of our churches and their mission in Cumbria.

God for all, you reached out to the world in your Son Jesus Christ.

Help us reach out in faith and love and witness to all.

God for all, you send your Holy Spirit to empower and gift your Church.

By your Spirit help us,

grow in unity,

grow as followers of Jesus Christ,

and grow your kingdom in Cumbria and in the world. Amen.

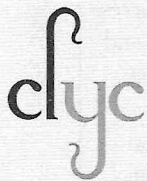
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Who are you and what is your role?

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accessible location, just 4 miles from Keswick, 20 minutes from the M6, with amazing views over Skiddaw and Blencathra. We offer self-catering facilities for groups from Cumbria and beyond, covering a wide range of activities and needs.

Describe the facilities that the centre has

We have two buildings that can be used independently or together. School House sleeps 25 in six 2 or 3 bunk-bedded rooms & a twin room, Chapel House sleeps 14 in 3 rooms. All our rooms have their own showers & toilets. The main building has a catering quality kitchen and a large dining room and separate Common Room, so it is ideal for teaching or indoor activities, as well as being a brilliant base for the wealth of outdoor activities on the doorstep. The Annexe is slightly more domestic in scale, but is self-sufficiently equipped.

Where do people come from to go to the centre? We get groups from all over the country - as one would expect mainly from the North of England (85%) just under a third of those from Cumbria, and a large proportion from North East, but we also have groups from Scotland, the South West and South East of England - a wide spread! We have schools, universities, church groups, cubs, scouts and families - a wide range of users who come to this special place.

Can you describe your role as warden?

I have overall responsibility for the day to day running of the Centre, overseeing routine maintenance, trouble-shooting issues, managing bookings, visiting the groups who come to the

Centre as well as offering Chaplaincy support where that is needed. It is a varied job - from rodding drains to leading worship, I have a small but dedicated Management Team who see to the practical needs of the Centre.

What is the role of the centre in supporting the church's mission?

The Centre gives a wonderful opportunity for groups to have time away and use the space and facilities in their way - all who come are touched by a sense of wonder in this place. I have met many people whose lives have been changed here, and who come back as adults with stories to tell of how important St John's in the Vale has been. We offer our ministry of welcome and hospitality to all in the Diocese and beyond - and the life of St John's in the Vale church next to School House enriches those who come to the Centre, and is in turn enriched by those who share with us. We have young people from very different environments for whom this is often their first opportunity to be in a 'wild' rural setting, and we have a special school from the North East whose children (and their parents) are finding a real freedom in a safe environment.

ABOUT THE DIOCESE

Communications - Moving Forward

Dear friends,

In May's Diocesan News, I detailed how we are improving the ways in which we can communicate as a diocese. This inevitably means some changes and it is important that everyone understands what is happening and why. These were explained in last month's Diocesan News, but I thought it helpful to reiterate what changes are being introduced to boost effective and efficient communication.

Q: What will happen to this publication, the Diocesan News parish

magazine insert? This edition, the June 2015 edition, marks the end of the paper format of the Diocesan News parish magazine insert. This decision reflects feedback from many churches who have previously asked that the Diocese considers moving towards an electronic version of the Diocesan News, with postage and other costs having been an issue for some parishes.

Q: How will the diocese keep you informed about what is going?

In April the diocese launched a new eNews bulletin - a digest of news, resources and events. This replaced the previous Diocesan Clergy Mailing. Initially the eNews was circulated fortnightly to clergy but the plan is for it to become a weekly bulletin. The distribution lists have also been expanded and include PCC officers across the diocese. There is also the opportunity for anyone to subscribe to the eNews via an easy-to-use eNews link which is available on the homepage of the diocesan website. The eNews includes links through to news items, events, the prayer diary and training resources as well as much more content which is available on the diocesan website. It will provide an important tool for parish magazine editors, giving them the opportunity to use (eg. download, cut and paste) eNews content (as they see fit) including the Leader's Letter when written, within their monthly publication.

Q: What about the What's On events? Full details of events listed in What's On will continue to be available on the Diocesan website as at present. Parishes wishing to publicise events on the website should send in details to Church House as they do at present.

Q: What is the future for the The Way, the ecumenical newspaper

for Cumbria? With a print run of 22,000 and a distribution network across the whole county The Way remains a vital vehicle for us as a Diocese and our ecumenical partners, to highlight the fantastic mission-focused work which continues across Cumbria. To that end, the plan is to increase the number of editions of The Way printed annually. Currently, three are printed each year - at Easter, Summer and Christmas. However, the intention is that six editions of The Way will be printed throughout the year, though pagination may be reduced slightly.

Change is never easy and effective communication is crucial for the diocese as we move forward together, looking to help more people connect with God and support Christians in their journey.
