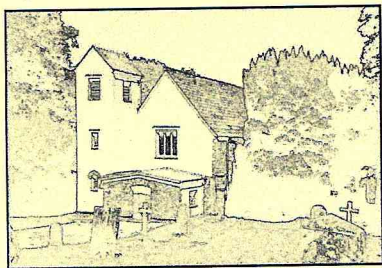
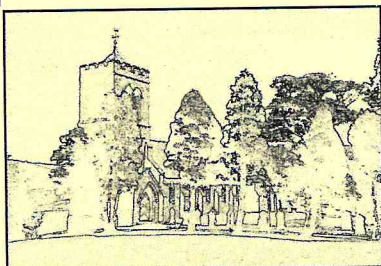

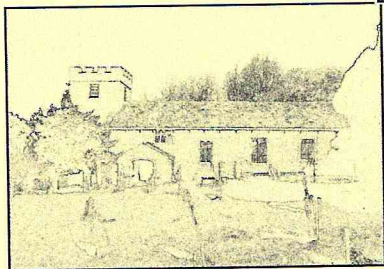

BAD NEWS AND GOOD NEWS

Dear Neighbours,

The Ancient Greek rowing-master was addressing the galley slaves. “The GOOD NEWS is that today you can have as much as you like to eat for lunch! The BAD NEWS is that, after lunch, the Captain wants to go water-skiing!!!”

We all have days like that. One Tuesday morning in my last parish, the post arrived with a Tax Refund for me – £347.98. That was the GOOD NEWS. Three hours later, I accidentally filled my petrol-driven Volvo with over £40 of *diesel*! It took 2 ½ hours to get back on the road, including an AA tow to Husborne Crawley, and a bill for £149 – (not to mention the contaminated fuel which had to be disposed of!) *That* was the BAD NEWS!

As human beings, Christians believe that we are *all* creatures of Almighty God. Not only has He *made* us, but one day He will call us to account to *Him* for the way we have lived our lives. The *wages* of our selfishness, wilfulness, waywardness or plain evil-doing is eternal *death* – that is, separation from God for ever, and from all that is happy and peaceful and good. That is the ultimate BAD NEWS.

BUT – wonderfully, in His infinite love and mercy, God has provided a way out. He has come to us, in the person of His Son, Jesus Christ, to take upon Himself the penalty for our sins – by giving Himself in sacrifice on the Cross. And God demonstrated the effectiveness of this, by raising Him to new and eternal life on the first *Easter Day*. And He promises that all those who believe in Him (i.e. who entrust themselves to Him) will likewise be spared and enjoy the blessings of Eternal Life. That is the GOOD NEWS – our Anglo-Saxon forbears called it “GO-SPEL”.

During May we shall be celebrating Ascension Day (14th) and the Feast of Pentecost (24th). According to the apostle Matthew, Jesus farewell word to His friends and followers was the promise,

"I will be with you always to the end of the age". Ten days later this mysterious promise was fulfilled when the Spirit of Christ, the Holy Spirit, came upon them with great power. And this same Spirit is available today, bringing peace with the LORD and with each other, and the power to live a life of Peace and Joy and Love. God's further promise is to give the Holy Spirit *to all who ask!* (And it is God's **free** gift!) Those of us who are already enjoying the blessing of the Spirit of Jesus (- "The Church") will be celebrating all this at Pentecost (= Whitsunday). And everyone is very welcome to join us.

Getting to know Jesus better

From Mark chapter 6 - New Living Translation of the Bible
Notes are by Matt Rich

14 Herod Antipas, the king, soon heard about Jesus, because everyone was talking about him. Some were saying, "This must be John the Baptist raised from the dead. That is why he can do such miracles." 15 Others said, "He's the prophet Elijah." Still others said, "He's a prophet like the other great prophets of the past."

16 When Herod heard about Jesus, he said, "John, the man I beheaded, has come back from the dead." 17 For Herod had sent soldiers to arrest and imprison John as a favour to Herodias. She had been his brother Philip's wife, but Herod had married her. 18 John had been telling Herod, "It is against God's law for you to marry your brother's wife." 19 So Herodias bore a grudge against John and wanted to kill him. But without Herod's approval she was powerless, 20 for Herod respected John; and knowing that he was a good and holy man, he protected him. Herod was greatly disturbed whenever he talked with John, but even so, he liked to listen to him.

21 Herodias's chance finally came on Herod's birthday. He gave a party for his high government officials, army officers, and the leading citizens of Galilee. 22 Then his daughter, also named Herodias, came in and performed a dance that greatly pleased Herod and his guests. "Ask me for anything you like," the king said to the girl, "and I will give it to you." 23 He even vowed, "I will give you whatever you ask, up to half my kingdom!" 24 She went out and asked her mother, "What should I ask for?" Her mother told her, "Ask for the head of John the Baptist!" 25 So the girl hurried back to the king and told him, "I want the head of John the Baptist, right now, on a tray!" 26 Then the king deeply regretted what he had said; but because of the vows he had made in front of his guests, he couldn't refuse her. 27 So he immediately sent an executioner to the prison to cut off John's head and bring it to him. The soldier beheaded John in the prison, 28 brought his head on a tray, and gave it to the girl, who took it to her mother. 29 When John's disciples heard what had happened, they came to get his body and buried it in a tomb.

Many people have different ideas about who Jesus is - some people think He is a religious teacher, others think He is a fraud, others that He never really existed. We all need to use the Bible to help us decide who Jesus is rather than just base our ideas on how we feel or things we have heard other people say. If we do this then we will discover for ourselves that Jesus is God, come to rescue us!

Herod liked to listen and learn about Jesus but what he heard didn't change him. We need to avoid this mistake - it's great to listen, it's great to find it interesting but it is even more important to let what we hear about Jesus change us from the inside.

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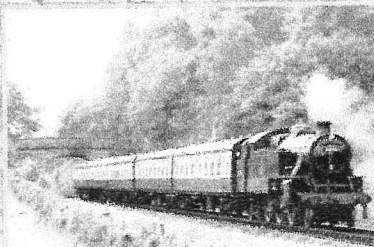


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TO THE GREATER GLORY OF GOD

If you visit Carlisle this month, you will find the South Transept of the Cathedral swathed in scaffolding. At long last, much-needed restoration work is taking place both to replace the decorative carved stone work above the main door of the Cathedral and also to repair flaking stonework at high level on the South wall of the transept.

That's the bare bones of the project we have in hand – thanks to a grant from the World War I Centenary Cathedral Repair Fund. But behind the project, as so often, there is a fascinating story. Dig down a little and all sorts of questions arise. Why was it that Carlisle lost more of its mediaeval monastic buildings than any other English Cathedral? Why was its New Foundation as the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in 1541, following the Dissolution of the Monasteries, no defence against a century of neglect - a century which left the Cathedral building itself in a state of disrepair? By the 1640s, we know, hard decisions had to be made to sacrifice the West end of the Cathedral and put available energies into saving the East end.

But losing the West end meant losing the main doors into the Cathedral and for two hundred years, the people of Carlisle had to make do with the small doors that existed on the South and North sides of the Nave. (The shape of the door on the South side is still visible on the Nave wall.) And so it continued until, in the 1850s, Dean Tait set about a major restoration of the Cathedral. Ewan Christian was the architect and, as part of the work done at that time, he proposed breaking through the wall of the South Transept to create a new, main doorway for the Cathedral. Wonderful, richly carved stonework (showing foliage and animals) was created in two orders in the arch above the door. Some people say that this work was inspired by the carving above the door of the Chapter House at Southwell Minster in Nottinghamshire.

So far, so good; but sadly the sandstone has suffered badly from wind and weathering. In places, the decorative carving has failed altogether and many will remember the wire mesh that for years has covered the carving that was left. Work on our project to date has revealed that the decorative carving included dragons, birds, mice - and a frog! Thanks to the skill of the stone carver all these delights will be there for all to see. We will have an inspirational entrance to an inspirational building again.

Why do I tell the story? Because heritage matters and because our buildings stand in eloquent witness to the faith, hope and love of those who raised them to the glory of God and gave their best efforts to this end. Why did those mediaeval stone-masons lash tree trunks together to create the shaky scaffolding of their day and build as high as their technical knowledge and abilities allowed? They did it to the greater glory of God. Whatever our vocation, it is to the greater glory of God and in the service of his kingdom that we offer our time and our talents today.

GROWING DISCIPLES WITH SCHOOLS



Who are you and what do you do? My name is Michael Mill. I am the Diocesan Director of Education, Children and Young People and I am also currently the Acting Chief Executive Officer for The Good Shepherd Multi - Academy Trust.

What is The Good Shepherd Multi - Academy Trust? The government are encouraging schools to become academies and be independent of local authorities. Where schools have been in difficulties there is also an expectation that they should become an academy. Where this has been the case we have been keen to ensure that any church school would remain part of the church family within our diocesan-wide academy trust. A multi-academy trust allows like-minded schools to come together to shape their own destinies and the way they do things together, including the services they need, within an overarching Christian ethos.

Why do you think this is an important development in Cumbria? With the local authority having less influence schools have been working together to support each other but church schools in the diocese tend to be small and rural and such schools face particular challenges with tighter budgets and falling rolls. It is important that the diocese provides a structure to enable church schools and others to be sustainable into the future so that they can continue to serve their local communities.

How many schools are in The Good Shepherd Multi - Academy Trust? Lazonby School joined the Trust on 1st February and we

had a wonderful welcome assembly together on the first day. We are currently working with a further three schools who will join the Trust in the near future.

So what else do you do? Well in terms of work I also have to get on with the day job: ensuring church schools get the support they need and helping them to continue to be both inclusive schools but also distinctively Christian in every aspect of their life. We appoint and offer training to over 500 Foundation Governors, support collective worship, RE, carry out inspections of church schools, help with appointments and monitor performance.

There are some fantastic things going on in our schools and I have tremendous admiration for the work of leaders including governors in schools. As parishes and mission communities consider their priorities, the vocations and training needs of lay people for the future we would encourage them to make schools and children a high priority. These are our schools and we have a responsibility for the achievement of the children attending and to use this great opportunity to develop links between churches, schools, and their families.



ABOUT THE DIOCESE

Dear friends,

In a Leader's Letter in The News in February, the Bishop of Penrith alluded to some changes in the way we communicate as a diocese.

Central to that is the introduction of a new eNews bulletin, initially e-mailed fortnightly and then weekly - replacing the Diocesan Mailing which has become less effective and well used.

The eNews will contain a digest of news and information on diocesan-wide issues and will provide an important tool for keeping everyone up to date across our diocese. It will be available to all those who want to subscribe to it.

In conjunction with this - and as set out in the February Leader's Letter - the current printed format of The News is to end. However, by subscribing to the eNews, everyone across our diocese, and beyond, will still be able to keep up to date with the latest news, events and resources.

Married with this, parish magazine editors will also have the opportunity to download and use copy and content which will appear in the eNews in their own publications.

Overall, this reflects an appetite from many churches who had previously asked that they receive The News electronically, with postage and courier costs having been an issue for some parishes.

It means that there will be a series of changes over the next few weeks:

- The June edition of The News, coming out in mid-May, will be the last edition.
- However the eNews will be available to subscribe in the coming weeks.
- Content from the eNews will be available for all parish magazine editors to use as they see fit and will include the option to print 'Leader's Letters' and the use of other news stories, features and information on resources and events.
- Full details of events listed in What's On will continue to be available on the Diocesan website as at present. Parishes wishing to publicise events on the website should send in details to Church House as they do at present.

And of course if you are aware of a good story then do please make contact with me for possible inclusion in future eNews bulletins.

As a diocese we would also like to thank Print Graphic in Carlisle who have been the designers and printers of The News for the past 17 years.

Lowick Parish Council

The last meeting of the Parish Council was held on 19th March. Parish Councillors reflected on the public meeting held recently in relation to the planning application to repower Kirkby Moor. This was an agenda item which was considered early in the business meeting to give members of the public the opportunity to offer their views. It was noted that young people in the parish may not have been forthcoming in expressing their views and it is likely that many are in favour of this new technology – in comparison with older residents. The Parish Council is, however, a representative body and needs to balance the opinions of all residents in the parish. In conclusion, it was agreed that a letter opposing the development would be sent to SLDC, highlighting the issues of concern.

Anyone wishing to send comments about the proposed development should send comments to SLDC by 15 May 2015, which is the deadline for this. By e mail, the address is developmentmanagement@southlakeland.gov.uk or by post to Kate Lawson, Chief Planning Officer, SLDC, South Lakeland House, Lowther Street, Kendal, LA9 4DQ, quoting the planning reference number SL/2014/1220.

Councillor Mitchell updated the meeting on the progress of superfast broadband. He has been informed (unofficially) that BT intends to install two new cabinets in the parish before the end of 2015 – this will enable Lowick to have the benefits of superfast broadband.

At the request of Mrs Ellwood, the Parish Council has agreed to get quotes for replacing the notice boards at Lowick Green and Lowick Bridge.

A number of agenda items were deferred because of the lengthy discussion about the RWE planning application.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on 21st May at 7.15pm in Lowick Community Hall. This is also the date for the Annual Parish Assembly and the Annual General Meeting.
