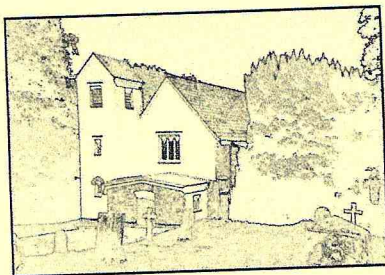


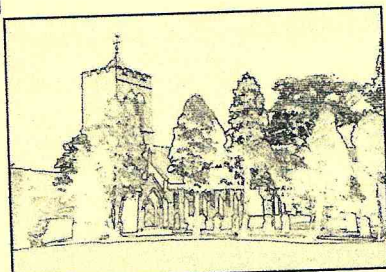

Dear Friends

As some of you know, Brian always begins his sermons with a joke – usually an awful one into the bargain. So I thought that I would follow suit in my letter this month, so here goes.....

A Sunday School teacher decided to have her young class memorise one of the most quoted passages in the Bible - Psalm 23.

She gave the youngsters a month to learn the chapter and little James was excited about the task - but he just couldn't remember the Psalm. After much practice, he could barely get past the first line. On the day that the children were scheduled to recite Psalm 23 in front of the congregation, James was so nervous, that when it was his turn, he stepped up to the microphone and said proudly,

"The Lord is my Shepherd, and that's all I need to know."

I think that he deserved a round of applause, don't you? Because, when we come down to it, that really is all we need to know.

Some Christian places of worship are inclined to make things seem more difficult than they really are; there is liturgy that seems unfathomable to people coming to the church to find out what goes on; there are hymns which seem to be irrelevant and old fashioned. When our message should really focus on God's saving love for us.

So here's another well-loved text that little James would have no trouble remembering.

"For God loved the world so much that he gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."
John 3:16

The Lord is your shepherd.

You are loved by God

What a wonderful promise.....but the challenge is – do you believe it?

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are continuing in chapter 14, which tells us about what happened just before Jesus' arrest

New Living Translation of the Bible - Notes by Matt Rich

12 On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, Jesus' disciples asked him, "Where do you want us to go to prepare the Passover meal for you?"

13 So Jesus sent two of them into Jerusalem with these instructions: "As you go into the city, a man carrying a pitcher of water will meet you. Follow him. 14 At the house he enters, say to the owner, 'The Teacher asks: Where is the guest room where I can eat the Passover meal with my disciples?' 15 He will take you upstairs to a large room that is already set up. That is where you should prepare our meal." 16 So the two disciples went into the city and found everything just as Jesus had said, and they prepared the Passover meal there.

17 In the evening Jesus arrived with the twelve disciples. 18 As they were at the table eating, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, one of you eating with me here will betray me." 19 Greatly distressed, each one asked in turn, "Am I the one?" 20 He replied, "It is one of you twelve who is eating from this bowl with me. 21 For the Son of Man must die, as the

I wonder who the man thought he had prepared a room for - had God told him to do this for Jesus? If not I wonder why he had done it and who he thought he had done it for? Jesus knew what this man had already done and He knows you really well too! He knows what you have done today, even the things that are strange! He knows us completely - the good and the bad.

Even though Jesus is fully aware of who is going to let Him down and sell Him to those who want to kill Him, He still remains calm, loving and caring. Jesus even allowed this person to share His last special meal. Jesus reminds the disciples that He "must die" - it had been written about and predicted in

Scriptures declared long ago. But how terrible it will be for the one who betrays him. It would be far better for that man if he had never been born!"

22 As they were eating, Jesus took some bread and blessed it. Then he broke it in pieces and gave it to the disciples, saying, "Take it, for this is my body." 23 And he took a cup of wine and gave thanks to God for it. He gave it to them, and they all drank from it. 24 And he said to them, "This is my blood, which confirms the covenant between God and his people. It is poured out as a sacrifice for many. 25 I tell you the truth, I will not drink wine again until the day I drink it new in the Kingdom of God."

the older parts of the Bible. It is part of the rescue plan that this sad and horrible thing had to happen. We needed Him to save us from the punishment we deserve for all the bad things we have done.

As Jesus shared the bread and the wine with His closest friends He explained more about His death to them. Breaking the bread, which He explained was like His body, showed them that His body was going to be broken - it was going to be hurt and die. As He shared the cup of wine with them He explained that it was like His blood which He was about to lose as He became a sacrifice for many people. The Jews would have understood the picture that Jesus was referring to was that of the Passover lamb. At the first Passover (which is what Jesus was in the middle of celebrating and remembering) a lamb was killed and it's blood used to mark which houses God would pass over and not punish. Jesus explained that His death and blood would enable us to escape being punished for the things we have done wrong. Jesus sacrifice would enable us to be forgiven and go free.

Lowick Parish Council

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 18 May. This was also the date for the AGM and the Annual Parish Assembly. Councillor John Longmire was re-elected as Chairman for 2017/2018 and Councillor Jo Edmondson as Vice Chairman. Councillor Chris Harrison advised that he intended to resign as a parish councillor because pressure of work made him unable to give a full commitment to the Council. This means that there will be a vacancy which can be filled either by an election, if required, or by the Parish Council co-opting an interested person. So, if anyone is fired with enthusiasm, contact your Councillors or the Clerk – details are on the web site.

During the business meeting, Councillor Edmondson confirmed that she would set up a Facebook page for the Council as a means of keeping Lowick residents informed. It is hoped that this will be useful during the period of updating the Parish Plan. A planning meeting was held on 24 April about the Parish Plan and representatives from local organisations will be invited to offer views and opinions at meetings to be arranged. There is also a proposal to have a stall at Lowick Show where people can make suggestions about what they want for their parish.

Councillor Mitchell reported on a meeting held by the Local Area Partnership which discussed rural crime and policing. The Police Commissioner has secured finance and new police officers will be appointed for the area. There are local initiatives, including a leaflet prepared by Colton and Satterthwaite, and anyone who sees anything suspicious is urged to ring 101 or email 101@cumbria.police.uk.

The Annual Audit is being prepared and the Clerk will ask Mr Ian Currie to act as the Internal Auditor. A meeting to approve the audit will be held in June.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on 20 July at 7.30pm in Lowick Community Hall.

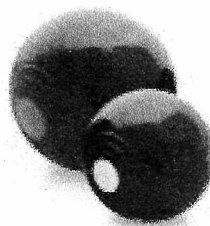
