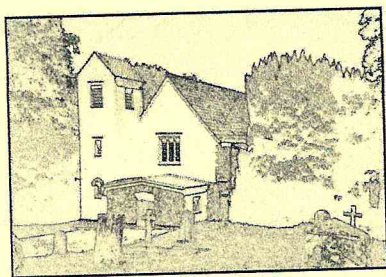


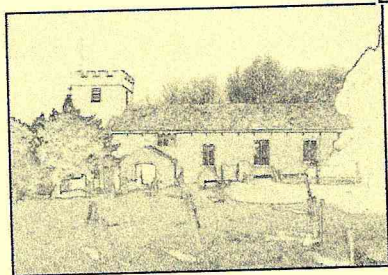

Dear Readers

How excited are you by the prospect of experiencing God? Are you ready for Heaven? I know that many of you have questions and uncertainties about your faith: – did the miracles really happen? How can I know the reality of Jesus? Has he forgiven me? Will I have a place in Heaven?

We are now in the season of Lent, a traditional season to draw closer to God in preparation for the Easter celebrations, but are we really hungry for God? I'm convinced that doubt comes from a lack of experience of God in Jesus Christ; I was once such an uncertain person. I still go through times of questioning, especially over the problem of suffering – but I believe in a Saviour who has endured terrible pain and suffering for you and me. I believe He still loves us, that He still suffers for us, as parents know suffering when their child is in distress.

A Cambridge professor of Comparative Religion asked the famous convert, Sadu Sungar Singh, what he found in Christianity that he hadn't found in Sikhism. He replied, "I found the dear Lord Jesus Christ". "Yes, yes" replied the professor, "but what philosophy did you find that convinced you", Sadu replied – three times to the professor's questioning, the same answer, "Professor, I found the dear Lord Jesus Christ"!

In 1949 a revival broke out in Hebrides, it began after two women, Peggy Smith aged 82 and her blind sister Christine aged 84, were burdened by the small congregations and the complete absence of young adults in church. They persuaded their parish minister and the local vestry (the Scottish equivalent of the PCC) to devote themselves to twice weekly evenings of prayer. They took prayer seriously, often praying until the early hours of the morning. They were particularly struck by the verse from Isaiah 44:3, 'I will pour out on him that is thirsty and floods upon the dry land.' The sisters repeated prayer was another verse from Isaiah 64:1 'Oh that Thou wouldst rend the heavens and come down.'

Some weeks later at the prayer meeting at 4-00 a.m. (!) the Deacon read from Psalm 24, 'Who shall ascend the hill of God ... He that has clean hands and a pure heart ...' He didn't get to the end of the Psalm when the Spirit of God fell on the meeting. The revival continued until 1952. The Revd Duncan Campbell was summoned to help from his parish in Glasgow; he was amazed to find a prayer meeting with 300 in attendance – within days it had grown to 1000! Young people in a dance hall left the dance when the Spirit fell and joined the Church. Seven Communists, well known in the Hebrides for their hostility to the Church, became pillars of the church! About 75% of those who found faith remained members of the Church until their lives' end, and many became missionaries and ministers.

The Revd Duncan Campbell wrote, 'A Christian is a supernatural being who has had a supernatural experience that is more than singing choruses; that is more than making a decision (for Christ); that is more than becoming a member of the Church. It is God at the centre of my life.'

Could such a revival happen in our valleys? Two things are necessary – a praying people willing to really engage with God, and a hunger for the Holy Spirit, both totally centred on Jesus Christ, not on seeking gifts or miracles, but on righteousness and faith. Miracles may then follow!

My personal prayer is that I may live to see such a reawakening – does such a prospect excite you? If so, join our Lent group, express your interest in prayer and come to the Prayer and Share services in Greenodd Village Hall: who knows, perhaps we can then discern God's presence in our lives and communities!

Getting to know Jesus better...

These verses are from the end of chapter 12 of the book of Mark
New Living Translation of the Bible - Notes are by Matt Rich

28 One of the teachers of religious law was standing there listening to the debate. He realised that Jesus had answered well, so he asked, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" 29 Jesus replied, "The most important commandment is this: 'Listen, O Israel! The Lord our God is the one and only Lord. 30 And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength.' 31 The second is equally important: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' No other commandment is greater than these."

32 The teacher of religious law replied, "Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth by saying that there is only one God and no other. 33 And I know it is important to love him with all my heart and all my understanding and all my strength, and to love my neighbour as myself. This is more important than to offer all of the burnt offerings and sacrifices required in the law." 34 Realising how much the man understood, Jesus said to him, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God." And after that, no one dared to ask him any more questions.

Jesus didn't give us a long list of religious rules that He wants us to follow. It's so much simpler than that, it's all about loving God! Jesus explained that there is only one God and we need to love Him with everything we have and everything we are. Then Jesus added something else, again this is not a religious rule but about the heart attitude - love those you come into contact with. Love God with everything and love those around you, there is nothing more important.

This man wasn't far from the kingdom of God - but that also means he wasn't actually part of it yet. He understood what to do but maybe he didn't do it? Maybe he hadn't understood that we regularly fail God and so we need to ask Him to forgive us for when we get it wrong and let Him down. What about you - do you think you are "not far" from the Kingdom of God, or do you think you are part of the Kingdom of God?

35 Later, as Jesus was teaching the people in the Temple, he asked, "Why do the teachers of religious law claim that the Messiah is the son of David? 36 For David himself, speaking under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, said, 'The Lord said to my Lord, sit in the place of honour at my right hand until I humble your enemies beneath your feet.' 37 Since David himself called the Messiah 'my Lord,' how can the Messiah be his son?" The large crowd listened to him with great delight.

38 Jesus also taught: "Beware of these teachers of religious law! For they like to parade around in flowing robes and receive respectful greetings as they walk in the marketplaces. 39 And how they love the seats of honour in the synagogues and the head table at banquets. 40 Yet they shamelessly cheat widows out of their property and then pretend to be pious by making long prayers in public. Because of this, they will be more severely punished."

41 Jesus sat down near the collection box in the Temple and watched as the crowds dropped in their money. Many rich people put in large amounts. 42 Then a poor widow came and dropped in two small coins. 43 Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has given more than all the others who are making contributions. 44 For they gave a tiny part of their surplus, but she, poor as she is, has given everything she had to live on."

This sounds a bit confusing but the religious leaders believed a rescuer, a messiah, would come but they thought that he would just be a special human. Jesus explained that hundreds of years ago King David understood that the rescuer was going to be more than just another human. Even though he was going to be one of his descendants, David also called Him, "my Lord" - because this messiah was also going to be from God. Jesus was the messiah, and yes, He is 100% man but at the same time He is also 100% God.

We must be careful not to decide what we think about Jesus and Christianity by looking at people who say they follow Jesus. We should look at what Jesus actually said and taught to decide if it is the truth and worth following. Just because some people show the outward signs of being religious doesn't mean they follow God - It is possible to be really religious and yet be far from God!

We don't need to compare ourselves to others and think, "I am useless, I have nothing to give compared to others, what can I do for Him". Jesus knows your heart, He knows all about you and He loves it when you follow Him with whatever you have. He knows when it was a sacrifice to do it or give it.

Lowick Parish Council

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 19 January.

Councillor Mitchell agreed to put a notice in the February parish magazine to ensure that anyone who wished to respond to the proposal by BT to close the telephone box at Lowick Bridge would have the opportunity before the end of the consultation period. To date, there have been no objections.

Thanks to the hard work put in by Councillor Sanderson, Lowick has replied to the consultation about the proposed pylons by the National Grid adjacent to our parish. It is strongly opposed to this.

Councillors are completing a map plotting the drains/gullies in the parish, adding additional ones and highlighting those that are blocked. This is an attempt to improve drainage and localised flooding. It will also comment on where flooding is most likely to occur. This will be sent to 'Better Highways' at SLDC as an additional reference tool for them.

District Councillor Anne Hall gave a report on the X11/X12 bus service. Continued fund raising is vital to maintain the service which serves a social as well as a practical need. She described how it appears that government funding appears not to have been used by CCC to support conventional bus services, like the X12.

Councillor Mitchell has inspected the bus shelters and identified that some work is required to keep them up to standard.

The Council is investigating the possibility of setting up a Face book page to keep local residents informed about activities. This will be helpful in receiving views when starting the update of the Parish Plan.

It was agreed that the Council would precept for £2,500.00 for the year 2017/2018 after considering a financial report prepared by the Clerk. This is the same amount as last year and will not affect your community charge!

The next Parish Council meeting will be on 16 March at 7.30pm in Lowick Community Hall.

B&S PCs most recent meeting was on 13th February, 2017

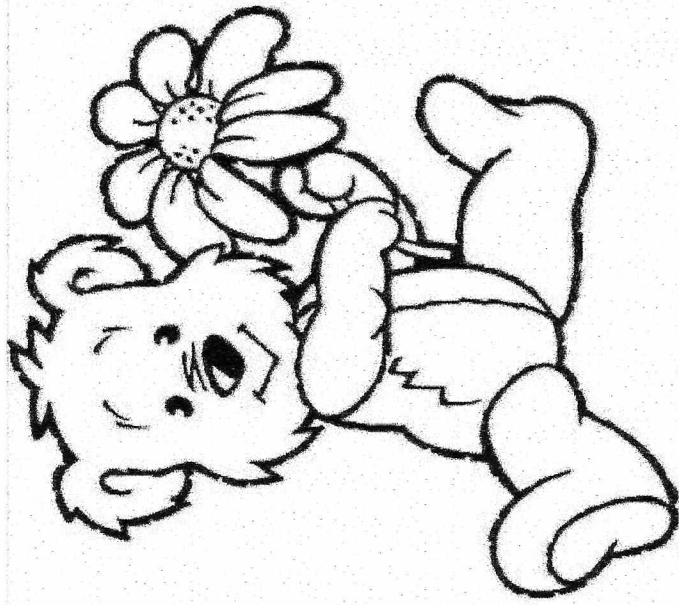
