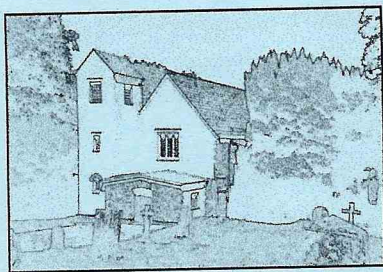
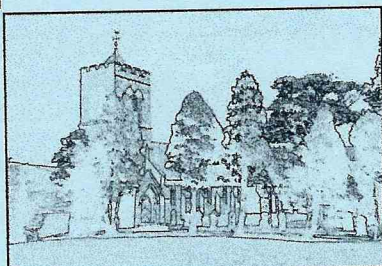

Dear Friends,

'Where is God when it hurts?' is the title of a book in my bookcase. That question, I suspect, is one that we have all asked in the face of sadness, anger and loss.

Perhaps it is fitting that in the dark and often gloomy month of November, we celebrate All Souls' day - that time in the church's calendar when we remember those who have died. For most, the pain of bereavement is not limited to one day a year but is a constant ache and sadness on many days. Where is God when it hurts?

There is no easy answer. In fact we rarely find the answer we want. In one of C.S. Lewis's 'Narnia' books, there is a conversation between Digory, a boy who knew his mother was dying, and Aslan, the lion, who is the Christ figure in those stories. Digory asks Aslan to give him something that would cure his mother, then looks up at the lion's face. 'What he saw surprised him as much as anything in his whole life. For the tawny face was bent down near his own and (wonder of wonders) great shining tears stood in the lion's eyes. "My son, my son," said Aslan. "I know, I know. Grief is great. Let us be good to one another."'

The Christian God is not one who is impassive, who remains aloof but one who 'knows' and weeps, as Jesus did at the tomb of his friend Lazarus. In fact at the heart of the Christian faith is Jesus, the Son of God Himself, painfully suffering and dying on a cross, called by the prophet Isaiah 'a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief'.

All Souls' Day may not feel like a particularly joyous festival but it gives us an opportunity to remember those we have loved and lost. Where is God when it hurts? Right there beside us, sharing the heartbreak and ready to give comfort and support.

Getting to know Jesus better...

Continuing with Chapter 15, Jesus' trial and crucifixion

New Living Translation of the Bible - Notes by Matt Rich

6 Now it was the governor's custom each year during the Passover celebration to release one prisoner - anyone the people requested. 7 One of the prisoners at that time was Barabbas, a revolutionary who had committed murder in an uprising. 8 The crowd went to Pilate and asked him to release a prisoner as usual. 9 "Would you like me to release to you this 'King of the Jews'?" Pilate asked. 10 (For he realised by now that the leading priests had arrested Jesus out of envy.) 11 But at this point the leading priests stirred up the crowd to demand the release of Barabbas instead of Jesus.

12 Pilate asked them, "Then what should I do with this man you call the king of the Jews?" 13 They shouted back, "Crucify him!" 14 "Why?" Pilate demanded. "What crime has he committed?" But the mob roared even louder, "Crucify him!" 15 So to pacify the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He ordered Jesus flogged with a lead-tipped whip, then turned him over to the Roman soldiers to be crucified.

16 The soldiers took Jesus into the courtyard of the governor's headquarters (called the Praetorium) and called out the entire regiment. 17 They dressed him in a purple robe, and they wove thorn branches into a crown and put it on his head. 18 Then they saluted him and taunted, "Hail! King of the Jews!" 19 And they struck him on the head with a reed stick, spat on him, and dropped to

The fact that Barabbas was released instead of Jesus is like a picture of what Jesus can do for you. Barabbas had done wrong (there wasn't any doubt about that) - and Jesus was innocent. Barabbas was guilty but was set free - Jesus was innocent but sent to die instead of Barabbas. It is Jesus death in your place, taking the punishment you deserve that can set you free too.

their knees in mock worship. 20 When they were finally tired of mocking him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him again. Then they led him away to be crucified.

21 A passerby named Simon, who was from Cyrene, was coming in from the countryside just then, and the soldiers forced him to carry Jesus' cross. (Simon was the father of Alexander and Rufus.) 22 And they brought Jesus to a place called Golgotha (which means "Place of the Skull"). 23 They offered him wine drugged with myrrh, but he refused it.

24 Then the soldiers nailed him to the cross. They divided his clothes and threw dice to decide who would get each piece. 25 It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. 26 A sign announced the charge against him. It read, "The King of the Jews." 27 Two revolutionaries were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left.

29 The people passing by shouted abuse, shaking their heads in mockery. "Ha! Look at you now!" they yelled at him. "You said you were going to destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days. 30 Well then, save yourself and come down from the cross!" 31 The leading priests and teachers of religious law also mocked Jesus. "He saved others," they scoffed, "but he can't save himself! 32 Let this Messiah, this King of Israel, come down from the cross so we can see it and believe him!" Even the men who were crucified with Jesus ridiculed him.

Even in the middle of all this undeserved pain and suffering Jesus knew that He had come to this point in His life to do a task - to suffer and die for you and me. He knew that He needed to take the pain we deserved so we could be forgiven and free. This is why He refused the pain reducing drink and faced the cross willingly, with courage and because of His love for you and me.

Jesus could have just come down from the cross whenever He wanted, He could have called upon thousands of angels to destroy those who had placed Him there. Jesus loved us too much to do that, He wanted to finish the rescue plan so we could be forgiven and become friends with God. Jesus didn't stay there and suffer and die because He had to - He took it all because He wanted to!

Hopefully some of you will have heard about the Conserving Coniston & Crake Project but for those who don't I'll give a little background.



Back in 2009 the Coniston & Crake Catchment Partnership was formed by residents out of concern for the condition of the freshwaters within the catchment, the decline in wildlife, and the increase of algal blooms and invasive water-weeds on the lake. Some monitoring and habitat improvements works were undertaken but it was decided that more was needed. Following support from the South Cumbria Rivers Trust, the National Trust and the Lake District National Park Authority a two-stage bid was put to the Heritage Lottery Fund to create the Conserving Coniston & Crake project, which was successful!

The project started this summer and will run for three years, aiming to improve the water quality, habitat and biodiversity in the Coniston and Crake catchment area, through conservation activities and community engagement. We want to show you what wonderful wildlife is found in and around the becks, river and lake through a series of events and activities. We will also be carrying out a range of conservation measures such as improving the spawning areas for salmon and trout, putting up nest boxes for birds and bats and reducing the amount of phosphates entering the watercourses.

We are currently putting together a programme of tasks and events for next year and are hoping to find some willing volunteers to lend a hand with some of the conservation work. If you'd like to know more, want a talk for a group, to discover what life is in your local beck or wish to help, then we'd love to hear from you.

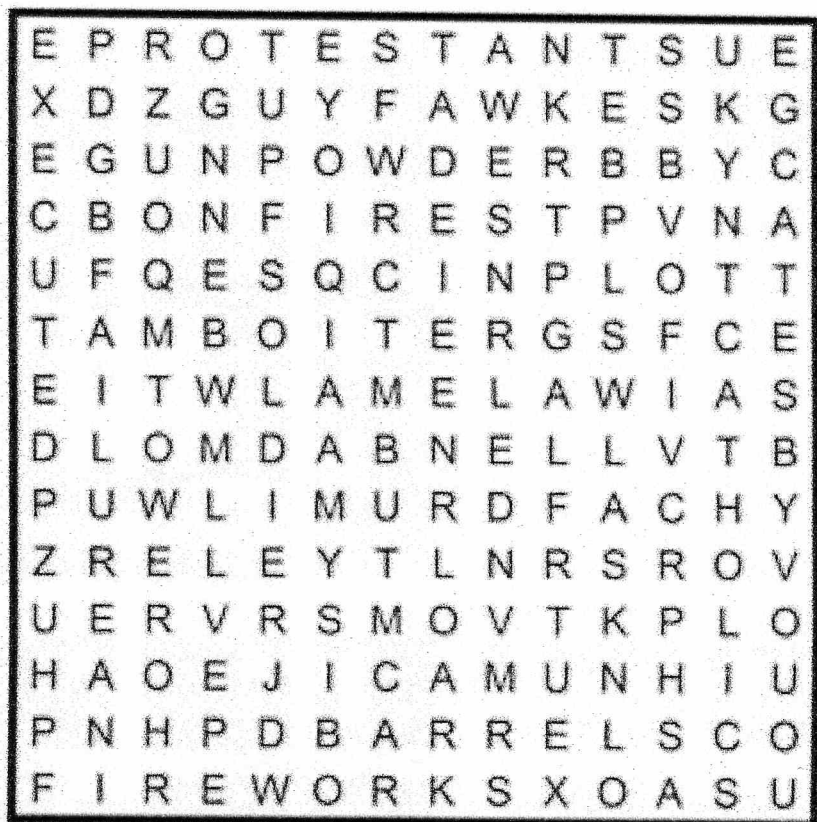
