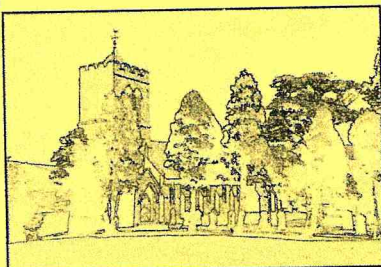

A SIGNIFICANT ANNIVERSARY

Dear Neighbours,

When Pope John Paul II was visiting Scotland, a Kirk Minister doing his rounds in the Gorbals came across a youth chalking "Down with the Pope" on a wall. Full of ecumenical spirit he demanded, "Wharra you doin' that for?" Recognizing his garb, the miscreant said, "Well – there isn't room to put 'Doon wi' the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland'!"

I was told this story by the Secretary of the Roman Catholic Ecumenical Commission for England and Wales – a sign of the greatly relaxed relations nowadays between Catholics and Protestants, which, I hope, may ease what follows. We are about to celebrate the 500th anniversary (on October 31st) of the posting of Martin Luther's challenge (in 95 theses) that sparked off the Reformation.

Perhaps "Celebrate" is not quite the right word. Another story, told to me by the Principal of the Belfast Baptist College, may serve to show what I mean. He said that an old Presbyterian in Hospital in Belfast was told that he was terminally ill. Wishing to die in his own bed, he discharged himself and went home. Feeling a little better on the following Sabbath, he struggled into his best suit and staggered off to church. But, much to the amazement of his friends and neighbours, he changed his habit of a lifetime and went into the Catholic Church instead of his own. After the service they met him coming out, and one said worriedly, "What did yer do dat for, Moike? Yer's allus bin a good Prod till now!" "Well," said Mike, "dey tell me Oi haven't much longer for dis world, so Oi figured it wuz better dat one of *dem* should die dan one of *us*!"

One cannot help but reflect that some of the deep wounds and rifts occasioned by the Reformation, not only between Catholics and Protestants but proliferating *within* the Reformed Churches as well (Episcopalian, Presbyterian, Baptist, Pentecostal, Brethren etc.) are still not healed – although, by the

grace of God, progress *is* being made - and that perhaps the Reformation itself ought not to be regarded as an unmitigated blessing!

What *is* an unqualified cause for celebration, however, is a prime feature of the movement – the coming to a new universal prominence of the Holy Scriptures. For centuries the Bible (usually only available in the Latin Vulgate version) had been the private, and greatly neglected, preserve of the Clerics of the Church. Now, thanks to the advent of the Printing press, and the translation work of Luther and Tyndale and the King James Bible on the Protestant side, and the Counter-reformation, the Second Vatican Council and the endeavours of Catholic Biblical Scholars on the other, a new consensus is emerging, based on a willingness to perceive the truth, and the will of God, through the testimony of the Prophets and the Apostles.

We do all need to be a party to this process, if a united basis for *peace* and *hope* and *reconciliation* and *patience* and *truth* and *love* is to be found. The personal acquaintance of all Christians with the Bible is vital. If it is not already your practice, could you consider making a daily Bible reading your own way of celebrating this significant anniversary? (The Cornerstone Bible Shop in Market Street, Ulverston has a very good selection of modern Bible versions and a staff well able to advise on bible study aids.)

Getting to know Jesus better...

More from chapter 14, telling us about the arrest of Jesus

New Living Translation of the Bible - Notes by Matt Rich

45 As soon as they arrived, Judas walked up to Jesus. "Rabbi!" he exclaimed, and gave him the kiss. 46 Then the others grabbed Jesus and arrested him. 47 But one of the men with Jesus pulled out his sword and struck the high priest's slave, slashing off his ear. 48 Jesus asked them, "Am I some dangerous revolutionary, that you come with swords and clubs to arrest me? 49 Why didn't you arrest me in the Temple? I was there among you teaching every day. But these things are happening to fulfil what the Scriptures say about me."

50 Then all his disciples deserted him and ran away. 51 One young man following behind was clothed only in a long linen shirt. When the mob tried to grab him, 52 he slipped out of his shirt and ran away naked. 53 They took Jesus to the high priest's home where the leading priests, the elders, and the teachers of religious law had gathered. 54 Meanwhile, Peter followed him at a distance and went right into the high priest's courtyard. There he sat with the guards, warming himself by the fire.

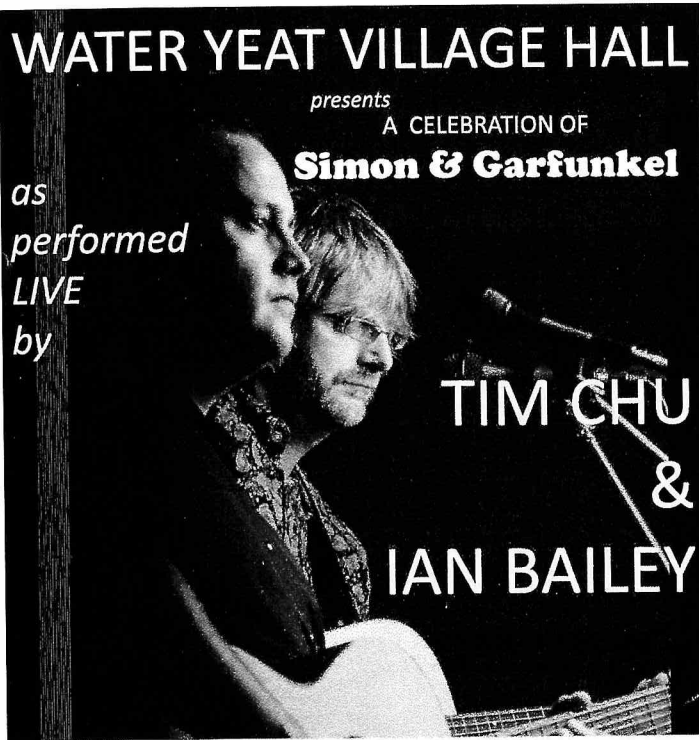
55 Inside, the leading priests and the entire high council were trying to find evidence against Jesus, so they could put him to death. But they couldn't find any. 56 Many false witnesses spoke against him, but they contradicted each other. 57 Finally, some men stood up and gave this false testimony: 58 "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this Temple made with human hands, and in three days I will build another, made without human hands.'" 59 But even then they didn't get their stories straight!

Jesus could have fought back, He could have asked for angels to come and protect Him. Jesus didn't fight to stop this because He knew this was the reason He had come to the earth - to die on the cross to make it possible for people to be friends with God. It had all been predicted in the earlier, older parts of the Bible.

Jesus was innocent, He had never sinned, people had to make things up to try and get Him killed.

Lowick Parish Council

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 20 July. Councillor Chris Harrison had confirmed by letter that he was resigning as a parish councillor. The notice for a casual vacancy has been displayed and no one has contacted SLDC to request an election. This means that the Parish Council can co-opt an interested person. So, if anyone is interested in joining the parish council, please contact your Councillors or the Clerk – details are on the web site. It is hoped that this co-option can take place at the September meeting.

During the business meeting, Councillor Edmondson confirmed that a Facebook page has been set up. As well as general information for residents, for example, the update of the Parish Plan, the agendas and minutes will also be posted.

Councillor Mitchell reported on the public consultation meeting held on 19 July by the group intending to put in a planning application to extend the life of the wind turbines on Kirkby Moor. The Council will need to consider its response when the planning application is received.

There was some discussion about whether the services of a lengthsman would be useful within the parish, for example, to keep the roadside verges, footpaths and gullies clear. Colton has a lengthsman and enquiries will be made to them. It seems that Highways and SLDC are doing less, although some gully sucking and grass cutting has taken place.

The Parish Council needs to set up a website that can give detailed information about its finances to be compliant with government legislation under the Transparency Code. The current website, shared with Lowick Community Hall, is insufficient for this.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on 21 September at 7.30pm in Lowick Community Hall. A speaker from the South Cumbria Rivers Trust will be giving an update on their work.

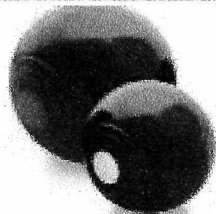
