

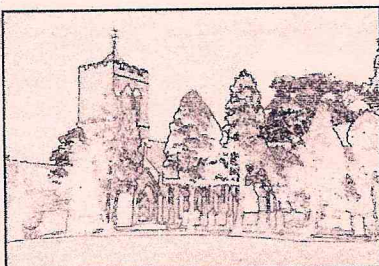

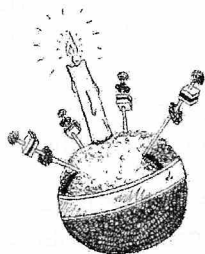

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are looking at the end of John, chapter 3

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

After this Jesus and his disciples went into the Judean countryside, and he remained there with them and was baptizing. John also was baptizing at Aenon near Salim, because water was plentiful there, and people were coming and being baptized (for John had not yet been put in prison).

Jesus and His disciples were telling people that they needed to change how they were living and follow Jesus. We know this because we are told that people were being baptised. Baptism was an outward physical symbol of a inward changed life. It was someone declaring that following God was more important than just living for themselves. We also know, from this description, that Baptism at this time was something that involved a lot of water - where someone was completely submerged.

Now a discussion arose between some of John's disciples and a Jew over purification. And they came to John and said to him, "Rabbi, he who was with you across the Jordan, to whom you bore witness — look, he is baptizing, and all are going to him." John answered, "A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven. You yourselves bear me

John came to prepare the way for Jesus, but what we see here is the reluctance of some people to change. The disciples of John had become comfortable with what they thought was good - but someone more important had arrived on the scene and they were too comfortable with what they had, and knew, to change

witness, that I said, 'I am not the Christ, but I have been sent before him.' The one who has the bride is the bridegroom. The friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom's voice. Therefore this joy of mine is now complete. He must increase, but I must decrease."

He who comes from above is above all. He who is of the earth belongs to the earth and speaks in an earthly way. He who comes from heaven is above all. He bears witness to what he has seen and heard, yet no one receives his testimony. Whoever receives his testimony sets his seal to this, that God is true. For he whom God has sent utters the words of God, for he gives the Spirit without measure. The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand.

Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.

and become a real follower of Jesus. This is a challenge to us all, because it is so easy to just follow the organisation that is pointing to Jesus rather than follow Jesus Himself. The equivalent for us would be to be a part of a church, and follow the church like a club, but not really follow Jesus, that the church is pointing to!

When we celebrate Christmas we often think about Jesus being born as a baby. But these verses in the Bible explain that Jesus didn't start existing when He was born as a baby - but He existed in heaven before He was born! This is a really important truth for us to grasp because it is this that points us to the fact that Jesus was not just a special spiritual man, but that the baby born in a stable is God Himself, coming to the earth to rescue us.

We all need to believe in Jesus and be real followers of Him so that we can be forgiven and avoid the wrath of God that the Bible says we all deserve.

We were fortified at regular intervals with tea, coffee and locally made cakes. And the rain stopped!

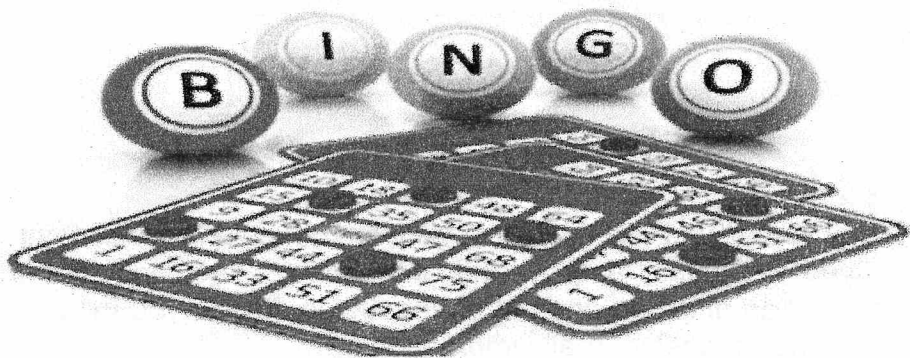

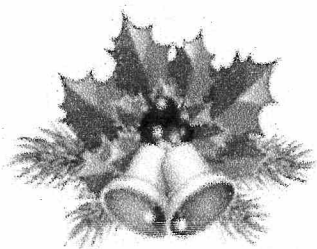
