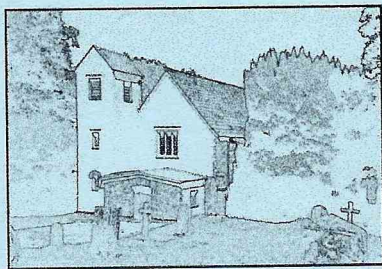
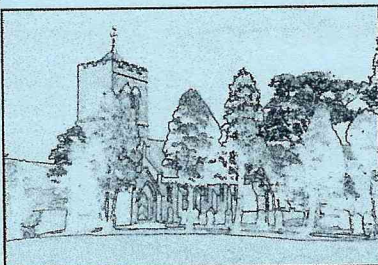

Pastoral Letter - Peter Fox - Coniston and Torver

A couple of weeks ago my wife and I had the care of our 4 month old Grandson. Our daughter had to attend a funeral of one of her students who had died in very tragic circumstances, so we decided to drive to a large shopping Centre where we would stay, and our daughter would take the car and then come back after the funeral. In all we had the care of Alisdair for about 4 hours. It was great to be able to spend some time with him, but also a big responsibility. We were a bit out of practice with babies! All went well; he behaved himself and slept most of the time!

As I reflected on this I wondered whether this was how the disciples felt when Jesus appeared to them after His resurrection. Jesus was giving them a much greater responsibility of continuing the work He had started. When Jesus appeared to the disciples He greeted them with "Peace be to you". This means "May God give you every good thing" He then gave them the commission which we as a Church must never forget.

Jesus needed the Church. When He returned to His Father Jesus needed the Church to be His mouth piece. Feet to run His errands, hands to do His work. The Church is you and me! The Church needs Jesus. For someone to be sent out they need someone to send them. Without Jesus the Church has no message. The Church cannot solve problems on its own. It needs the wisdom and strength of Jesus. Jesus then breathed on His disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit.

Easter was a great time. With the Walk of Witness, the Sunrise Service on the shore of Lake Coniston was well attended and Bikers Breakfast went well. In St Andrew's we had a different Communion Service which attracted a good number of both adults and Young People. All of these services were designed to announce the Easter message which Jesus instructed His disciples and us to proclaim.

The message of Easter is not just for Easter but all through the year. Christ is risen. He is risen indeed.

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are continuing in John, chapter 1

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.

Last month we discovered how John called Jesus "the light". The light came into our world to shine. John is using "light" to describe and compare the purity of the perfect Jesus with the sinfulness (darkness) of all humans.

He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him.

The world was made through Him, because Jesus is God and God made the world - but most of the people of the world didn't recognise that God was with them in the form of Jesus.

He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him.

The Old Testament part of the Bible explains that God chose a particular people of the earth to reveal Himself to, the Jewish people. When Jesus came to the earth, He came as a Jew and lived amongst His fellow Jewish people. But, even though they were looking for God's messiah to come and rescue them, they didn't think Jesus was the rescuer.

But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

The wonderful news for us though, is that Jesus opened up the way for us who aren't Jews to be rescued and become God's special children. But it says we have to do something... receive Him and believe in Him - then we will be rescued, by Jesus, God's special rescuer.

Have you believed in Him?

Lowick Community Hall

On Friday 20th April the hall celebrated its 10th anniversary of the changing of status from Sunday School to Community Hall. The Hall committee were present as was a representative of the Village Green Management Group. The Parish Council were in force and a small number of residents also attended.

The Chairman of the Hall thanked those present for their attendance and went on to pay tribute to the committee past and present for their efforts in managing the development of school to Community Hall. Special mention was made of the important vision and work at the start of the project by James Wood and David Gregg.

In the absence of The Chair of the Village Green Management Group due to illness, Rob Dove read out the developments that hopefully will occur this year. The wetland area is to have the collapsed culvert restored. This will allow access to the well and reduce the amount of surface water around the trees. The passing place opposite Rose Cottage is to be made more secure in order to reduce the mud and improve its purpose. Wild flower planting is to continue and The Young Farmers are to improve the area opposite the cottages on the main road, where fallen trees have damaged the wall.

The sell-out fund raising event for the Village Green raised in excess of £800 which will be used for maintenance and grass cutting in the coming year.

Finally The Chair of the Parish Council urged parishioners to get in touch with any issues for consideration for the new parish plan. After the presentation all enjoyed chatting over a glass of wine and cheese and biscuits.

Finally, at Arrad Foot, we are sad to say 'goodbye' to Karen Hadwen, and would like to thank her for her years of committed service.

Lowick Parish Council

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 19th March. It had to be delayed from the 15th March because the council was not quorate.

Richard Ellwood, Chairman of Lowick Green Management Committee raised some items which councillors considered. There are funding difficulties and Councillor Longmire wondered whether the Young Farmers might help with some of the environmental management tasks. He will make enquiries and report back.

Councillors discussed some highways issues, and it is felt that a site visit with an officer from Highways would be the best way to highlight these. One problem is the satnav sign just past the old school which has been misinterpreted by drivers who try to negotiate the narrow road and inevitably get stuck at the farm. Other problems have been HGVs running off the A5092 and there is still no sign at the Coniston junction. There have been complaints about an impromptu sign advertising the sale of eggs on the A5092 just coming into Lowick parish. It is unlikely that Highways have given permission for this and Councillor Longmire will make enquiries with the person concerned.

Following a complaint by a resident about the drains on the fell road, the Lengthsman gave this a priority and his work has made a significant improvement to the run off.

The Clerk was asked to send a letter of thanks to a local farmer who cleared away the brash created after Councillor Mitchell had trimmed the hedge along the footpath between Lowick Green and the Farmer's Arms. His help is greatly appreciated.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on 17th May at 7.30pm in Lowick Community Hall. This is the date for the AGM and the Annual Parish Assembly. All are welcome.
