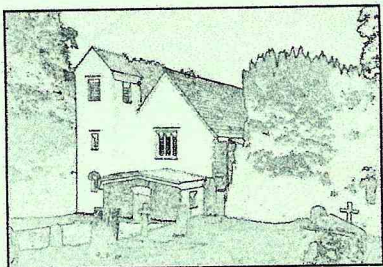


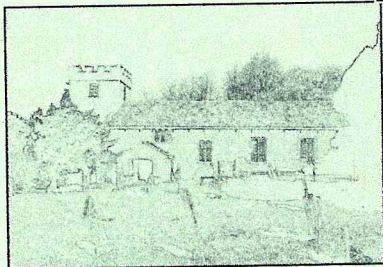
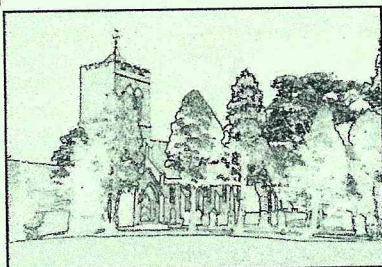

Dear Readers

Remember remember the fifth of November – and the rest of the month! All Saints Day starts the month, followed by All Souls, then 'Bon fire' night and above all else, Remembrance (Armistice) Day, which this year is on Sunday.

People need to remember, and in a post Christian society we have seen the growth of 'way side shrines' marking past lives, often places of a roadside death. All Saints Day, which kicks off the month, is traditionally a Church day to mark all the 'lesser' non 'red letter' saints of the Church. But the New Testament speaks of the saints in - meaning those who are in Christ living in certain towns and cities. In other words 'saints' are both the living and departed in Christ. If you love Jesus, God sees you as one of His 'saints'! All Souls Day is in my view, an anachronism, if we give thanks for all God's people on the 1st why repeat it for the faithful departed on the 2nd?

Even worse is the corruption of All Hallows to Halloween, turning a Christian festival into a macabre celebration of all things dark and evil! Make no mistake about it, Jesus spent his ministry liberating people from evil forces, the Cross marked the true D Day for the end of the powers of darkness, so why celebrate them? Better to have a festival of light, for Jesus is the victor, He is the Light of the World, in Him no darkness is found!

Bonfire night of course is a celebration of the saving of Parliament from the Guy Fawkes plot. An excuse for fireworks, but isn't it a bit sick to burn the effigy of a man, foolish though he was? Still Bon fire night is harmless enough, but while Fawkes failed, war has nearly brought us to destruction. Remembrance Sunday, falling this year on Sunday the 11th, marks the important centenary of the end of the 'war to end wars'.

Remembrance is history, it's vital that we remember lest we continue to make the same mistakes, it's important that we honour

the memory of those who gave their lives that we might have freedom. History is though, 'His Story' and the greatest act of Remembrance is the one we take part in every time we break bread in worship: 'in remembrance of me'. The Greek tense is to bring not only to mind the sacrifice of Christ, but to enter into the mystery of the one and only sacrifice of Calvary that assures the believer of forgiveness and a place in Heaven. The Lord's Supper – Holy Communion – the Eucharist (thanksgiving) is one of two sacraments Jesus commanded His followers to do, baptism, the initiation sign of being joined to the death and resurrection of Christ, and Holy Communion, the Church's family 'meal'.

Remembrance can lead into darkness or light. As the nation remembers the darkness of war and especially this year, the horrors of The Great War, let us remember that there will always be conflict between good and evil. But let us not forget the greatest act of sacrifice ever shown, that of Christ, who as the Apostle Paul wrote, "And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." (Philippians 2:8).

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are looking at the beginning of John, chapter 3

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel

Jesus did so many amazing things that people could only come to the conclusion that He was someone special.

This is the place in the Bible where the phrase "born-again Christian" comes from. What we see here is that it is not the name for a particular group or type of Christian, it is what all Christians must be!

What Jesus meant is that when you become a Christian something completely life changing happens to you and it is like you are starting a new life - not a new physical life because we don't suddenly become young again!... but a new spiritual life, one that effects how we live and changes everything about our aims and how we live this life.

and yet you do not understand these things? Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed. But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God.”

One of the things we can notice here is that Jesus is saying that He has already been in heaven! And that is because He existed in heaven before He came to the earth to rescue us.

This is the most famous verse in the Bible, because it explains so much in so few words!

*- God loved you
- so Jesus came to rescue
- if we want to have eternal life, and not perish, then all we have to do is “believe in Him”.*

We see that it is not about having to do special good religious deeds, or being a better person than most other people. The Bible says that we simply need to believe in Jesus.

But, we also just read that real belief is like being born again - we know our belief is real because it will change everything!

Lowick Parish Council

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 20 Sept. I apologise for no report being available following the meeting held in July.

Richard Ellwood, Chairman of Lowick Green Management Committee, attended to give some feedback following the Tour of Britain and the associated event held on Lowick Green. This was very successful, raising £435 for the Green committee, There has been no progress with CCC Highways about traffic issues in the parish but District Councillor Ann Hall thought that County Councillor Matt Brereton might be able to support Lowick in their endeavours to make changes/improvements.

The Parish Council has agreed to support the group 'Kirkby Moor Protectors' in its work to oppose the appeal by the developers against the decision taken last December to refuse planning permission to extend the life of the wind turbines. This will allow Lowick to become a member of the Party which will enable it to play an active role in the new appeal by the developers taking place at a public enquiry in January 2019.

Councillor Sanderson is involved in initial meetings which will explore the possible extension of the southern boundary of the National Park. This is particularly relevant for Lowick as the parish is divided by the current national park boundary. These are exploratory meetings, a public roadshow is proposed for next year.

Parish Plan: Thank you to all who visited the stall at Lowick Show and, in particular, made written comments about what they would like to see us achieve over the next few years. Councillors are aware that Lowick is not a neat, compact parish and that it needs to make the public more aware of what is going on. One suggestion has been a regular newsletter distributed to households. Further discussion by Councillors is planned at a meeting in October. New or further ideas can be shared with any of your parish councillors. There is a Facebook page too. Our next meeting is 15 Nov at 7.30pm in Lowick Community Hall.
