

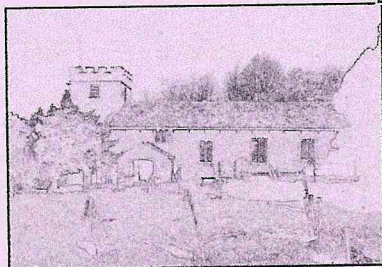
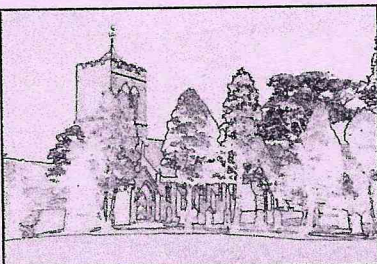

Dear Friends,

It still delights me that we live in such a beautiful place. Climbing the hill behind our house and seeing the fells and mountains in the distance never fails to inspire me to give thanks to God. The apostle Paul points out that it is one way in which we can all see something of the nature of God 'Ever since God created the world, his invisible qualities, both his eternal power and his divine nature, have been clearly seen; they are perceived in the things that God has made.'

Some time ago, on BBC Radio 4, there was an interview between a church leader and an atheist professor of mathematics. The professor chided the church leader 'How can you believe God creates something out of nothing? It is so irrational, how can you get your mind around that?' The church leader replied: 'I admit that God creating something out of nothing is a difficult concept to get your mind around. But what does the professor believe? That nothing - created something - out of nothing! That is a lot more difficult to get your mind around.'

Last week we spent a day on Lindisfarne or Holy Island, off the Northumberland Coast and were reminded of the close links the Celtic saints had with the created world. Cuthbert often left the priory for days, sometimes years when he went to the Inner Farne, to find solitude and pray in the midst of God's creation. Legend has it that he would stand in the sea praying and the seals would come and rest on his feet!

If we delight and respect the created world, that is what God intended and at this time of year, when we celebrate Harvest, we remember the fruitfulness of that world.

John's gospel also reminds us that 'God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.' It is only through Jesus that Creator and creation are brought together in loving relationship.

Administrator – Coniston & Crake Valley Benefice

Administrator – The Vision : If the church is a body – then the Office Administrator is the administrative heart. Your job is to help us maximise the impact of our people and resources by making sure that whatever is needed to keep the body functioning gets to where it's needed, when it's needed! Detail matters in this role – but you'll have the wisdom to know which details really matter, so you can enable others to get on with their work.

Person Specification

A) You'll enjoy working independently, to enable others to focus on their core roles. You'll enjoy "figuring it out" yourself, be adaptable, like solving problems and have a can-do attitude. (B) A good level of written English and Numeracy are essential, and you'll need to be organised, and a confident negotiator. (C) You'll need to be computer literate (Word, Excel and Google Calendars) and web-literate, and confident about learning how to use new software packages quickly. (D) You'll have good inter-personal skills, and the ability to be patient. (E) Whilst it's not essential, it would help if you are a committed Christian, with some knowledge of the Church of England, preferably living in the local area.

Hours: 14 hours per week. Core hours are: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 9:30am-1.00pm. This pattern could be varied by agreement with the vicar to allow a consistent pattern of administrative availability.

Location & Employer: Your employment location will be at the residence of the vicar – The Vicarage, Penny Bridge, Cumbria, LA12 7RQ. Some home-working may be permitted, at the discretion of the vicar, by agreement in advance. There may be the occasional requirement to visit the Coniston & Torver parish office based in St. Andrew's, Coniston and to co-ordinate with another part-time administrator with oversight of Coniston & Torver. Your employer will be Egton cum Newland Parochial Church Council (PCC), who will be employing you on behalf of the four parishes in the Benefice of Coniston & the Crake Valley.

Salary & Expenses: £10.63 per hour, 14 hours per week, £7,738.64 per year, (£20,452.12 full-time equivalent). Travelling expenses for duties from The Vicarage will be paid at the rate of 45p per mile. Holidays: 28 days pro-rata, i.e. 78.4 hours paid leave per annum including bank and public holidays.

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are looking at the second half of John, chapter 2

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there. And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and oxen. And he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. And he told those who sold the pigeons, "Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade."

His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me."

So the Jews said to him, "What sign do you show us for doing these things?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews then said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and

Many people find it a real shock to read that Jesus did something like this. We often think of Jesus as someone who was only ever meek and mild, someone who would never do something as strong and confrontational as this. It is the same misunderstanding that says because God is love He will accept all or most people into heaven. But the Bible teaches something quite different! - because God is Holy, when we do bad things He won't just ignore it, as if it doesn't matter to Him. That's why we need Jesus to rescue us!

Jesus is predicting His death , but much very significantly He is also predicting that 3 days later He will be alive again.

will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

Jesus Knows What Is in Man
Now when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover Feast, many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he was doing. But Jesus on his part did not entrust himself to them, because he knew all people and needed no one to bear witness about man, for he himself knew what was in man.

It is belief in Jesus' death and resurrection - in Him taking the punishment we deserve for the bad we do and think - that means we experience God's love and forgiveness.

Many people put their trust in Jesus and followed Him.

- What about you?

- Have you put your trust in Him?

This message of how to people can be rescued by Jesus is the same for all people, in all times of history and in all cultures and countries.

But these words of John also explain that some of the people that started to follow Jesus then gave up on Him. They turned their back on Him and went their own way because they preferred to live their lives with themselves as king rather than follow Jesus as their King.

Conserving Coniston & Crake Project Update

The project undertook its first phase of reedbed restoration at the end of August. Reedbeds are an important habitat for a variety of species and help to filter sediments and phosphates. Strong and invasive species free reeds were harvested from RSPB Leighton Moss then replanted along a section of shoreline at Water Park Lakeland Adventure Centre. The reeds were protected with fascines (brash bundles) and a fence. These bundles will break down in time as the reeds become established. More restoration work is planned over the next two years.

Last month's Bat Walk was an enormous success with plenty of bats to look at and listen to via bat detectors. Rich Flight from South Cumbria Bat Group was very informative and enthusiastic, giving a great insight into the world of bats.

We've got quite a few volunteer opportunities coming up this Autumn from cleaning gravels to improve conditions for spawning fish, tree planting and redd counting. Details will be finalised shortly so please look on our website for details or contact Kath for more information.
