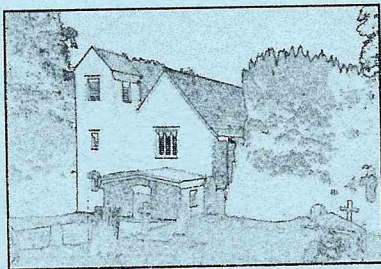


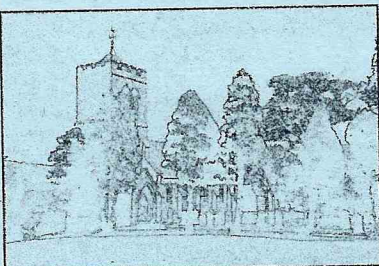

Signing

You may or may not have heard of or seen the movie “A Quiet Place”. It is a relatively new movie, but it is now available on video and the common on-demand streaming services.

In this movie, set in a small town in North America, the nation, and possibly the world, has been overrun by marauding monsters – not sounding so good, so far! The monsters find people with their super-super-sensitive hearing. So, everybody has to be super-super-quiet to stay alive, hence the name of the movie “A Quiet Place”.

But the family at the centre of the movie have a distinct advantage over other families as their eldest daughter is deaf, and so they are very used to signing. However, at the beginning of the movie, because of a mistake by the deaf daughter, the youngest son is killed. And so, in the movie, we see very strained relations between the daughter and her father. She thinks he blames her and therefore, no longer cares for her. And this is how we often view our Father God. He must be angry with that thing we have done in the past – we know what it is – so how could he ever possibly still love us?

However, at the pivotal moment of the movie, where the father saves his children, before doing so he signs to his deaf daughter. He signs the words “I love you” but crucially for his daughter he goes on to sign “I have always loved you” even when her younger brother died.

And this is what God, as Jesus nailed to the Cross, signs every day to you, “I love you”. But even remembering that worst moment of your life – whatever you did – he goes on to say, “I have always loved you”.

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we are looking at the first part of John, chapter 2

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it.

This is the first miracle that we know Jesus did. It was at an important event, as marriage and family life were really significant part of their culture. Mary wasn't just concerned about everyone becoming thirsty - it was a shameful thing for the family not to have provided sufficient drink for the people invited to the celebration.

These were really big containers! Jesus wasn't just make one or two bottles of wine, this is more than 600 bottles! He provided more than they needed to cover their shame! This is a picture message to us of what Jesus does for those who follow Him - Jesus died not to give us the bare minimum, but to cover our guilt and shame abundantly! Giving us far more than we could ever deserve - His love, adopting His followers into His spiritual family and treating them as His loved children.

When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now."

This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

After this he went down to Capernaum, with his mother and his brothers and his disciples, and they stayed there for a few days.

Another exciting thing we discover here, is that when Jesus does something, He does it well. What Jesus provided was the very best. It didn't just cover the family's shame - but it made them out to be better than they really were and better than they deserved. This, again, is a picture of what Jesus does for those who follow Him - not only do we find forgiveness for the things we have done wrong but we also receive His help and His un-earned and un-deserved blessing.

There are 7 different times in this book written by John, when he mentions a miracle being a sign - seven signs to point us to Jesus. This first sign was enough for some people - they saw the water turning into amazingly tasty and plentiful wine and put their trust in Jesus. What about you?

This paragraph tells us a little bit about Jesus' home life growing up. Jesus was brought up with other siblings. In another passage in the Bible we read that Jesus had sisters as well as brothers. From references like this it also does seem likely, although not definite, that by the time Jesus started his public ministry his step-father, Joseph, had died.
