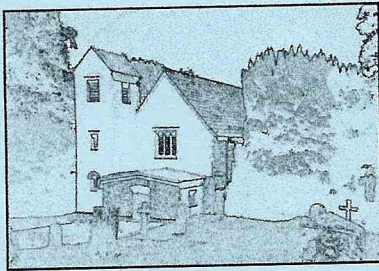

Dear friends,

Across the road from the house where I spent my childhood stands the local library. Built in 1908 to serve the local community it is today still going strong. The library cost £8,183 to build and was funded by a trust set up by the steel magnate and philanthropist, Andrew Carnegie and in 2012 became a Grade II listed building. I recall spending many hours in that library, first of all in the children's section and later studying for homework and exams. In particular I recall using the library to help revise for my G.C.E. English Literature O Level exam. The set books were *Great Expectations* by Charles Dickens and something by Shakespeare (I confess I never could get to grips with dear William hence my lack of recall as to the exam subject matter, however despite my lack of enthusiasm for his works I did pass the exam).

Our next door neighbour was Mr Bromley. I cannot recall having seen Mrs Bromley, just an awareness that she had passed away some time before I was aware of such possibilities. One day Mr Bromley called me into his front room and asked if I would like to borrow some books. He offered me Winston Churchill's *History of the Second World War*. There were six volumes, each bound in red leather with pages so thin they felt like tissue paper. I recognise both the library and Mr Bromley's encouragement and generosity as being a spur to my enjoyment of reading.

The above recollections were prompted by the sight of a 'mini library' in the former red phone box in Oxen Park, and a collection of books (and a chair) in a remote bus shelter in Poolewe in Scotland. Each mini library may not be Grade II listed but each provides the opportunity for those so minded to enjoy reading a book they may never have had the opportunity to do were it not for

these improvised libraries. The repurposing of the phone box in Oxen Park also includes the housing of a defibrillator.

The Christian life is like that phone box in Oxen Park. The defibrillator is a reminder of both the frailty of life and the power to save life. This saving power lies in Jesus Christ alone. To release Christ's power to heal and save, not only for this life but for all eternity, there must be the confession of need, the admission of sin, and the acknowledgement of our helplessness to effect any inward change under our own power.

Only Christ alone can bring new life to the human heart and through this, acceptance by God.

The books, with their variety of subject and dust jackets, are a reminder human beings are varied in shape, size, depth and outward presentation. Yet each person is a veritable living library of books: a history book; a dictionary and thesaurus; an encyclopedia of facts and wisdom; and for the Christian, a testimony of Christ's power to heal and to save.

We are each created uniquely and are fearfully and wonderfully made. We bear, to a greater or lesser extent, the hallmarks of our Maker upon our lives, and our response to Him; and all this for the world to see and read. May all that we are, all we think, do and say, reveal the new life that is ours in Christ Jesus and encourage those who pass by to find Him for themselves.

Sadly, our Clerk of the last year has decided to leave. Sally took over the post at a difficult time, and, in spite of her newness to parish council affairs, has done much to restore communications within the community and return our affairs to good order. We thank her for all her work, and wish her well in the future.

MEETING 2nd July 2019

Present were Councillors Brian Campbell (in Chair), Howard Graves, Becks Thomas, Tony Mayo, Denise Edmondson and Colin Richards

Also present were Sheila Hobson and ,for part of the meeting, two members of the public.

The two members of the public raised their concerns about the fitness for purpose of the Penny Bridge bus stop used by a growing number of children from the village. The Council's attention was drawn to as number of issues including the lack of

signage, the lack of a pavement on either side of the road, no street lighting at the bus stop and a perceived increase in both traffic and speeding along the A5092. The Council was sympathetic and acknowledged the issues. The Chair suggested a meeting on site between the two members of the public and Cllr.Willis.

The Council agreed to co-opt Sheila Hobson to represent the Egton Ward. It was reported that the resignation of Peter Taylor had created a casual vacancy which would have to be filled by co-option after advertising the vacancy.

Councillor Thomas reported that there were safety issues arising from parents parking their cars opposite Penny Bridge School. The Councillors agreed to look at the site during the next parish inspection and to support the school in writing to the police and highways department.

The Council was given feedback on the recent Southern Boundary Partnership meeting attended by three of the councillors. It was agreed that the views of as many parishioners as possible should be sought as discussions of the proposed changes continue. The proposed Southern Boundary was to be included on the agenda for the next meeting and advertised in the parish magazine. Members of the public would be encouraged to attend and express their views. As discussions continue it would be important for all those who wish their views to be represented by the Parish Council to contact their local Councillors or the Clerk (enmoparishcouncil@hotmail.com).

The Council dealt with other routine business including planning applications and the role of Councillors in advising on them. It agreed to adopt updated standing orders on policies and procedures.

The next meeting of the Council will be on 3 September in Spark Bridge Village Hall. Parishioners are encouraged to attend, especially if they have views on the possible extension of the boundary to the National Park. Any items for the agenda should be sent to the Clerk at enmoparishcouncil@hotmail.com by August 19.
