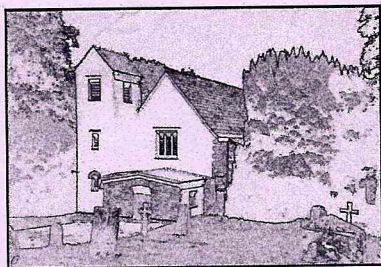

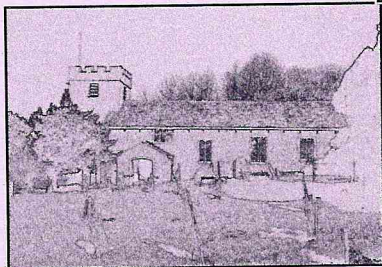

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Pastoral letter - November

Over the last few weeks we have been looking at the book of Nehemiah in the Benefice and how he dealt with the problems of rebuilding the walls in Jerusalem. We are talking about 445BC. Jerusalem had been ransacked in 587 BC and a lot of the residents were either killed or taken to Babylon in exile.

When the book starts Nehemiah is cup bearer to the king in Babylon which seems like a cushy life but we have to remember that one way of killing the king was to poison him and as a cup bearer Nehemiah was first in line. He hears from some people who came back from Jerusalem that the walls were broken down and the gate burnt and he was heartbroken. Nehemiah obtained permission from the king to go back to Jerusalem, with letters to give him safe passage, building materials and an escort of armed men.

Nehemiah was a risk taker and took on an immense task but he was a man of vision and of prayer. When problems arose which they surely did he took everything to God. He had lots of opposition from all side but overcame it all.

We are approaching next month the time of remembrance for those who made the ultimate sacrifice not only in 2 world wars but in the conflicts since. They took risks and in many cases the risk was too great, they gave their all so that we could be free. There were many Christians amongst them who felt it right to go to war. Many became Christians because of what they went through. Over the next few weeks we need to pray and ask God to be close to those for whom the Remembrance Day will be very traumatic.

Just recently my Granddaughter started at Oxford University to read Geography. She had worked hard for many years and had to overcome some quite severe difficulties but she persevered and made us proud when she got the right grades and started at Oxford. We have been praying for her for many years and seen her grow up and become a credit to her parents.

At funerals I often use the poem Footprints A person is going across the sands in a dream and when the going is good she sees two sets of footprints when the going gets tough she sees only one. She challenges God with the words "when things got difficult you left me" God replied, "no my child I did not that was when I carried you"

We need to remember God is there all the time and what we have to do is to reach out and let him take control.

Getting to know Jesus better...

This month we continue to look at John, chapter 6

English Standard Version of the Bible

Notes by Matt Rich, pastor of Bethany Christian Church, Ulverston

Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst.

Jesus often described himself and what He came to do in picture language. Elsewhere when he said "I am the door", he didn't mean he was a literal door, but that He was acting a bit like a door. And here when He states "I am the bread", again He is saying that what He is doing is acting like bread

But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe. All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out. For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me.

We often think of Jesus coming into existence as the baby born at Christmas, but here Jesus is explaining that He was alive in heaven before He came to the earth. He came from heaven to the earth to do the job that God the Father wanted Him to do.

And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day."

The job Jesus came to do was rescue people who "look to the Son and believe in Him", they will all live forever with God when they die.

So the Jews grumbled about him, because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." They said, "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How does he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Jesus answered them, "Do not grumble among yourselves. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the last day. It is written in the Prophets, 'And they will all be taught by God.'

Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me - not that anyone has seen the Father except he who is from God; he has seen the Father. Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life.

I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The people understood He was explaining He used to live in heaven before coming to earth.... and this confused them because they knew His earthly parents - they did not believe in the virgin birth, Joseph wasn't his physical father, God the Father was!

Hearing about Jesus and what He came to do is not enough, Jesus explained that we also have to have "learned" - which means not only heard, but have also understood and believed.

Jesus again describes himself as "bread" but this time adds a little extra explanation... "the bread of life". He is relating "eating this bread of life" to the phrase He used earlier "whoever believes". What we learn is that eating the living bread, is really consuming and absorbing what Jesus came to do - dying on a cross to take the punishment you deserved.

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him.

As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever feeds on me, he also will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like the bread the fathers ate, and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." Jesus said these things in the synagogue, as he taught at Capernaum.

The people really didn't understand what I have just explained - they were simply focusing on how odd it is to be told to eat someone! So Jesus explains it to them again... The only way to have eternal life in you is to absorb and believe in Him.

Jesus makes the comparison between physical bread that doesn't last and His spiritual message about spiritual bread - spiritual bread which if we feed on we will live forever!
