Pastoral Letter from Revd. Harry Welch

Dear friends,

The origin of the saying 'A picture paints a thousand words' is disputed. Some claim it was first said by an American salesman in the early 20th century. Others assign it to a Russian playwright in the 19th century; yet more claim China (Confucius) was the home of those who first heard the wisdom. Wherever it originated, the truth contained within the six words cannot be disputed. Images are powerful.

When Jesus spoke to people about the Kingdom of Heaven He regularly painted oral pictures to make a point. We know them as parables. Some of the most well known are The Parable of the Lost Sheep, The Parable of the Sower, The Good Samaritan and The Prodigal Son. Parables may seem simple however the messages they convey are deep and central to His teachings.

The aim was to use a simple, well known event, experience or action to reveal a deep spiritual truth. The Lost Sheep reveals God's love for us all and how he searches for us and brings us home to Him. The Parable of the Sower exposes the various responses made by those who hear His call. The Good Samaritan displays God's love as having no boundaries or barriers. The Prodigal Son warns of the folly of man's choices and the patience and love of the Father. Jesus ended the telling of the parable with these words, "Whoever has ears to hear let them hear".

The parables were not entertainment but Christian truths to encourage those who hear to evaluate their standing before God. If far off, then The Lost Sheep reveals God seeking to rescue. If having heard God's call, the Parable of the Sower demands an assessment of the depth of the response. The Good Samaritan asks us to explore the depth of our experience of God's love. If we walk by, past those in need or if we attempt to divide communities into 'them and us' groups then an adjustment in the working out of our faith is required. If we have tasted that the Lord is good but have turned our back upon Him and followed the ways of the world then the parable of the Prodigal Son has encouragement for us.

The parables illuminate the New Testament Gospels and can be found by a simple Google search. If having passed the above assessment test and we believe we have come through with flying colours then we must be careful not to fall into complacency. If we claim to be Christian, to own Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour then we too become parables as we live out our faith in a world which is quick to abandon Christianity and soak in the false comforts of the world. The Christian writer Henri Nouwen applauded church attendance as a source of spiritual refreshment, uplifting worship and a place of accountability. By simply going through the church door we are revealing we adhere to the Christian way of life. If that only exists for the hour in Church on a Sunday then those in the community in which we live will know the depth of our faith. God cannot be fooled and neither can the community.

What kind of parable are you? What is the message God you conveys through you by your thoughts, your words and your deeds? How could God use your life to bring others home to Him? If you are not a Christian, but know people who are, what message is God saying to you through them?

The Lake District Summer Music Festival

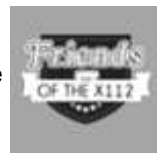

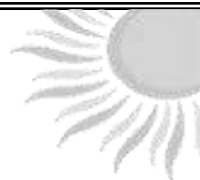

YFC Southern District Field Day

Along with hundreds of other Young Farmers, parents, advisory members and supporters, Lowick Young Farmers gathered to enjoy a fantastic day of competitions on Saturday 21st May, at the Southern District's Annual Field Day. This year, it was held at Hartley Castle Farm, near Kirkby Stephen, by kind permission of the Dixon family and organised by Pennine YFC. This Field Day had been many years in the planning, with it first being due to take place back in 2020. We've been waiting over two years for the biggest event in the Southern District YFC calendar, so not even the changeable weather could dampen our spirits.

With nearly 100 competitions making up the Field Day, there's always something for everyone. As ever, Lowick members had been training and preparing hard over recent weeks, and managed to land some excellent results. Hayley Simpson's 1m x 1m display on the theme of Mary Poppins picked up first prize, as did Lucie Wilson and John Cook in the Open Log Saw competition, and Ben Cooper with the Club Programme, among many others, as well as a great showing for the club across the Stock Judging competitions. Lowick's team also picked up a much-coveted joint first in the Grand Finale which sees young farmers in fancy dress race against each other, and against the clock, to complete an improvised obstacle course made up of tyres, crawling nets, silage sheets, and a lot of water!

The Tug-of-War competitions were fiercely fought. Lowick's Men's and Junior teams came joint second in their leagues, just missing out on the knock-out round. Pennine YFC won the men's competition with their Juniors and Ladies' teams coming away with 2nd place, and Sedbergh YFC finished first in both the Junior and Ladies'.

A special competition this year was the Decorated 100th Birthday Cake, which was included in honour of Mrs Olive Clarke OBE, who is an Honorary Life Vice President of Cumbria YFC and NFYFC, and who celebrated her centenary on May 19th. Mrs Clarke became a young farmer in 1938 and remains to this day an enthusiastic and much-loved member of the Cumbria YFC family. Mrs Jan Davinson (former Cumbria YFC Chief Officer) was delighted to judge the competition and awarded 1st place to worthy winner Jess Black of Crook YFC.

Alex Dixon, the Field Day Chairman, commented on what a fantastic day it had been, thanking David and Sally Dixon for being such welcoming hosts. He went on to thank the Field Day Secretary, Jess Rogerson, Dance Secretaries Neil Curr and John Dent and Programme Secretary Becka Richardson for all their hard work and support. Alex also thanked the 220 judges and stewards who had helped to make the day such a success. Finally, the overall results were announced as follows:-

1st – Pennine (10,163), 2nd – Kent Estuary (10,007), 3rd – Grayrigg (9830), 4th – Sedbergh (9502), 5th – Lowick (9434), 6th – Crook (9196), 7th – Eden Valley (9186), 8th – Furness (8006), 9th – Cartmel (7881), 10th – Broughton (7242)

This saw Pennine YFC take home the Cock of the North Shield for Overall Field Day Winners.

A THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH by Rev. David Gregg

JULY : SABBATH REST

As part of my studies during our time at Lindal, I went to the wonderful Jewish Library in Manchester, and stayed with a Christian friend in Prestwich, where there is a prominent Jewish presence. I noticed that most of the Jewish gardens had a large metal arch over the gate, and asked why? My friend explained that the Sabbath regulations allowed certain tasks to be done within your own courtyard. The regulation is based on the concept of a house built around a *central* courtyard, and it is the last *arch* of your house which defines the area covered by the allowance. So, to enable certain gardening tasks to be done on the Sabbath, an arch over the gateway brought your garden within the regulations!

The Jewish predilection for law has led to some other classic examples. For instance, since it is forbidden to kindle a fire on the Sabbath, the Jews of Caesarea were told that, although it was okay to use the local hot springs for washing etc. on weekdays, they mustn't use them on the Sabbath because they were the result of Satan kindling the fires of hell, and blatantly breaking the Sabbath law!

But, just in case this seems to sound like a *Jewish* monopoly, Christians can be just as legalistic when it comes to keeping the Sabbath. The fishing boats in the Hebrides used to set out at one minute past midnight on Monday mornings, for instance. And a much loved lecturer at Tyndale, Dennis Tongue, once alarmed us considerably by poking fun at *us* on this matter in a devotional bible study on the first epistle of John. He was dealing with the statement that the man of God cannot sin (1 John 3:9). He said, "I suppose you lot think that you are alright because you don't let the milkman deliver milk on a Sunday. But the milk you take in on Monday was *distributed* on Sunday, and the milk you take in on Tuesday was *bottled* on Sunday, and the milk you take in on Wednesday was *collected* on Sunday, and the milk you take in on Thursday was *milked* on Sunday!"

With its *five* Sundays and the beginning of the general holiday season, July invites a 'thought' on the Sabbath and "rest". Its importance is highlighted at the very beginning of the Bible story:

"(God) rested on the seventh day from all the work that He had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it." (Genesis ch. 2 vv 2,3)

"The Sabbath is made for man, not man for the Sabbath," said Jesus. (Mark 2:27). It is meant as a day of blessing – of rest, recuperation and leisure. It is the first spiritual institution in the Bible, and the subject of the first *positive* commandment, "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy." (Exodus 20:8) It is the unique sign (and proof?) of *human* spirituality. Every other measure of time (Days – of which hours and minutes are sub-divisions, Months – the phases of the moon, and Years – marking the earth's orbit of the sun,) has its basis and counterpart in the natural world, and trees and flowers, animals, fishes and birds all live by them and relate to them. But there is nothing else in all creation that is geared to the seven-day Week, except humankind. And we particularly suffer if we ignore or desecrate the day of rest.

Christians have, of course, transferred the Sabbath to the day of Resurrection, the *first* day of the week. In the Jewish household, in Jesus' day, families or groups of friends would mark their Sabbath meal by sharing a special cup, called the Berakah cup – the “Cup of Blessing”. At the Last Supper it was *this* cup to which Jesus attached the rubric “As often as you drink it”.

The fact that He attached it to the actions with the bread *and* the wine, and carefully underlined the use of the Cup of Blessing as the ‘time-factor’ provides an essential clue. (i.e. that He was commanding His friends to hold a *weekly* commemorative meal of His coming sacrifice.)

This certainly became the *practice* of the early church, and, it is my sincere belief that all of us who claim to be Christ's disciples *should* do all we can to attend a weekly communion service, to mark ourselves out as those who truly understand the importance and blessing of the Sabbath.

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SLDC UPDATE



MAY ELECTIONS At the Councillor elections in May for the new Westmorland and Furness Council, Suzanne Pender was elected on the Coniston and Hawkshead and Matt Brereton for High Furness. There will be a Shadow Council, running in parallel with SLDC and Cumbria County Council until April 2023, when it takes over. Tracy, Helen and Ian will remain as District Councillors and Matt will remain as County Councillor until then.

WINDERMERE FERRY There was a public consultation on 7th June, by Cumbria County Council in Bowness on the Mallard replacement. The specifications so far are that it will be Roll on, Roll off, Electric, has capacity for 15 cars and there will be a shelter for pedestrians. It is likely to be built within the next 2 - 3 years.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT SLDC is allocating a one off energy rebate payment of £150 to most properties in Bands A to D. Households will be receiving a letter shortly.

VISITOR MANAGEMENT The Tactical Visitor Management Group has put plans in action, in coordination with Safer Lakes. The 56 day rule for pop up camping and car parking has not been extended, but the 28 day rule still applies. As expected, the Park is less busy this year as overseas holidays restart. There is also a drop in visitors and spending as people are being more careful with their pennies and due to the escalating price of fuel. Next Prayer Hour will be **Wednesday 6th July, 10am-11am**.

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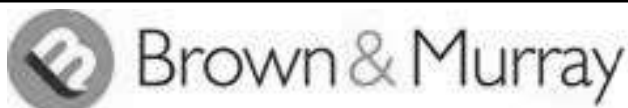
