Easter Sunday is always a particularly joyful time for Christians as we turn from the sadness of Good Friday to the celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead. The service this year at Colton was particularly special because it marked the end of Joanna Henson's public ministry amongst us. She has been a faithful servant over many years first as a Lay Reader and then as an ordained minister. At a time when she had retired from work and 'could put her feet up' she answered God's call and took on the academic and practical work necessary in order to be ordained and serve in this Benefice. Rachel Tarr put it into words as she said that Joanna had 'married their children and baptised their grandchildren!' Many of

you, in the community, will also remember the gentle and sensitive way that Joanna handled the funeral services of loved ones.

At the end of the Easter service she was presented with flowers and an Easter egg which had inscribed on it the words 'He is risen'. It was the living Lord Jesus Joanna first committed herself to as a young girl and who has been her strength ever since.

The current vicar in the Benefice, the Reverend Brian Streeter, said that *"Joanna has always been a willing and active member of the ministry team. She eagerly contributed to and supported the work with children and young people, including in our local schools. I am sure that Joanna and Bob will continue to be active in our church family in the bottom of the valley, but they can now take life a little bit easier"*.

We look forward to the next chapter in Joanna's ministry and service to our communities.

Pastoral Letter from Pam Priestley

Dear All,

A few evenings ago we watched a television programme in which Jamie Oliver, the well known chef, talked about his life with dyslexia. He talked about his school days and how things that seemed so easy for others, such as reading and writing, were so difficult for him. The recollection of that has prompted him to start a campaign to enable young children to be screened for dyslexia but also for teachers to have more training in teaching neurodiverse children rather than using the same academic pattern for all.

A few days before I watched that programme I was preparing for an 'all age service' on the theme of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit was given to the disciples. It struck me as never before, when I looked at the text, how God used 'pictures' to communicate mind-blowing truth. There was no lecture on the theology of the Holy Spirit as they sat in a classroom but the disciples 'saw' flames of fire and they 'heard' a rushing wind. A 5 year old in the service could see (and did) that when he blew a toy windmill the fans went round and his 11 year old cousin could explain that you couldn't point to the wind but you could see what it did.

Jesus taught through stories and picture language knowing that all would be able to understand. He pointed to the soil at the wayside, to the lilies of the field, to bread being baked. Jesus was passionate about the message he was giving - a message for all, young and old, clever and simple, rich and poor. The people who listened found that they could begin to see and understand and trust Jesus. In fact, his fiercest criticism was towards those who wanted to make truth complicated and wordy so that ordinary people felt defeated and marginalised.

On the day of Pentecost people saw quite clearly the difference the Holy Spirit had made in the disciples. May our passion and 'campaign' in the church today be to speak clearly and show the love of Jesus in our lives.

The room was packed for the annual parish open meeting held at Finsthwaite & Lakeside Village Hall with guest speaker Gavin Capstick, Chief Executive of the Lake District National Park Authority. Thank you to Gavin, everyone who came along, who submitted a question and who helped make the meeting a great success.

Underlying all the questions raised was the theme of how LDNPA can work alongside communities to achieve a balance between the needs of local people, supporting sustainable and thriving communities and LDNPA's statutory purposes of conserving and enhancing the natural beauty, wildlife and cultural heritage of the National Parks; and promoting opportunities for the understanding and enjoyment of the special qualities by the public.

It was good to hear Gavin talk about building a broader based economy that will enable people to live and work locally; and to hear about LDNPA's commitment to tackling climate change. But Gavin was honest about the obstacles, the lack of resources and the limitations of the Park Authorities Powers.

The way forward seems to be working with partner organisations, including communities, businesses and the local authority.

Lowick

Lowick Parish Council

Paul Forshaw from United Utilities has agreed to attend our meeting in July to updated us on the new pressure management system recently installed on the mains water supply at Lowick Bridge, and to discuss the recent work to the leak on the Fell Road on Lowick Common. We hope as many parishioners will attend as the last time he visited.

Your councillors have distributed a Lowick Newsletter survey asking Parishioners for their thoughts and feedback on how to spend the legacy left to them in Nigel Lord's will. Nigel's expressed wish is that this should be used for the benefit of all parishioners of Lowick Council. Your ideas will be discussed at the next Council meeting on 17 July 2025.

It has been brought to our attention that Fibrus intended to implement their planned erection of telegraph poles carrying overhead fibre broadband along the public highway across Lowick Common before discussing this with the landowner, This falls under permitted development rights so does not require full planning permission. The Landowners are in discussions with Fibrus and the work has been put on hold, they are keeping us informed on progress. We have discussed this with Hyperfast Networks External Stakeholders Manager and are hopeful that a satisfactory compromise can be achieved. The installation in other areas of our Parish is still progressing but the hold on this part of the network will delay areas which require its connectivity first.

We have learned of an environmentally focused Woodland Management Project within our Parish which is being developed with The Forestry Commission and Woodland Trust. The councillors discussed the summary of the report submitted to The Lake District National Park Authority and are very much in favour of the development and its ethos to protect and cultivate a small parcel of woodland in The National Park from over-commercialisation whilst actively encouraging the local wildlife.

Two Planning applications were accepted on condition that their development complied to the Lowick Parish Plan.

Your councillors were all extremely disappointed to hear that the LDNPA have served an enforcement order for the removal of the small tool shed near Lowick Green, despite the vast majority of parishioners being in favour of its purpose.

Our Clerk intends to retire in the near future so we are looking for someone to take over her duties. A full job description is available, please contact lowickpc@outlook.com if you are interested. We should also like to hear from you if you are interested in becoming a councillor.

Our next Meeting will be at the Lowick Community Hall on the 17th July 2025 at 7:30 pm everyone is very welcome to attend.

Update from the National Trust in the South Lakes



There's so much going on at National Trust properties this summer.

At **Beatrix Potter's Hill Top** there's a new display **Pets to Page: The Tale of Two Bad Mice**. Go on a journey from inspiration to conservation, with Beatrix Potter's newly conserved dolls' house at the heart of the story, which recently featured in BBC Two's Hidden Treasures of the National Trust, Series 3 Episode 1. See original artwork, animations, and a new display in the Scullery, charting Beatrix Potter's work with the National Trust to preserve the Lake District. This is available from 15 Feb–2 Nov, 10am–5pm. Also, this summer - storytelling and short yoga sessions in the orchard and a celebration of Beatrix's Potter's birthday. See website for dates.

Wray Castle

Summer of Play kicks off on 28th June and stretches across the summer holidays. Designed for families and children of all ages, Wray's outdoor spaces will become zones of activity. Enjoy outdoor games and get creative.

Since November 2024, the Castle has been closed to allow for a **major refurbishment programme**, including urgent and essential conservation, roof and repair works, fire protection, security upgrades, and rewiring. This work is part of our commitment to preserving the building for future generations. The parkland, grounds, car park, and toilets all remain open, with seasonal outdoor activities continuing. Joey's Café is also open daily 9.30 to 4.30.

Our work in the South Lakes

Windermere West Shore: Harrowslack

As part of our nature restoration work and our visitor management plan, work has been taking place on the Windermere West Shore just beyond the NT Harrowslack car park. New fencing has been installed on the lakeshore past the cattle grid at Strawberry Gardens to support revegetation of this area of lakeshore which has become vulnerable to erosion because of visitor pressure over many years. Additional work includes changes to the lakeshore laybys to manage parking more effectively. The National Trust, along with other partners, are working on several additional measures to manage the anti-social behaviour which can on occasion occur.

To support our visitor management around Cathedral Quarry, improvements have been made to waymarking providing signposted routes, from Tilberthwaite and Hodge Close car parks as well as through Stang End and Slater's Bridge. There has

also been work to manage erosion issues to footpaths around Slaters Bridge and a webpage on the National Trust website offering information to manage visitors' expectations and help them plan a visit.
