Pastoral Letter from Revd Joanna Henson

God Has No Hands but Your Hands!!

Each year, OUP publishes a Children's Word of the Year language report, delving into the trends in children's language and how it is shaped by children's engagement with topics from that year, ranging from politics, climate change, to cultural events.* In 2024 the word chosen that they felt has been important was "kindness".....yes "kindness".

In a world which seems to be so filled with violence and conflict this fills me with hope that the world can become a better place. There is still room for kindness.

History has seen so much violence many lives and homes ruined and well loved landmarks destroyed. This brings me to the heart of this letter, drawn from a story of a church that was destroyed during World War II and nothing remained but a heap of rubble and broken glass.

Church members, however, miraculously found a statue of Christ still standing erect. In spite of all the bombing it was unharmed—except that both hands were missing.

The congregation began rebuilding the church facilities. One day a sculptor saw the broken figure of Christ, and offered to carve new hands. The church officials met to consider the sculptor's friendly gesture and decided not to accept the offer.

Why?

Because the members of that church said: "Our broken statue reminds us that Christ has no hands to minister to the needy or feed the hungry or enrich the poor—except our hands. He inspires! We serve!"

Perhaps they had memories of one of the favourite poems of St. Teresa of Avila:

*Christ has no body but yours,
No hands, no feet on earth but yours,
Yours are the eyes with which he looks
Compassion on this world,
Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good,
Yours are the hands, with which he blesses all the world.
Yours are the hands, yours are the feet,
Yours are the eyes, you are his body.
Christ has no body now but yours,
No hands, no feet on earth but yours,
Christ has no body now on earth but yours.*

We pray for peace on earth but it begins with you and me and this poem is a timely reminder of the part we play in ministry with Christ! Christ ministered to the poor and hungry, healed the sick, forgave sins, blessed others, reached out to saint and sinner; and sought to help the least, the last and the lost...

And then Jesus said to his disciples – that's you and me....,
"Go and do likewise." (Luke 10: 37).

Kindness begins with you!

Candlemas Service, Colton Church, February 2nd

Colton Church was alive not only with the sound of music but with the voices of the children enjoying church.

A joyful celebration of Candlemas with a biblical story, St. Luke's gospel, explaining the significance of light. An innovative service for four generations of our valley.

Children were warmly welcomed, encouraged to roam freely (under discreet watchful eyes of adults aware of health and safety measures)

A long red carpet and centre aisle provided opportunities for running, sitting and climbing; freedom of movement to explore under pews, even reach windowsills! Older children guided younger ones.

Activities were carefully, sensibly planned, stimulating curiosity.

Example – parable of the Good Samaritan using a stained glass window. Children were visually captivated, keen to find someone who has been robbed and injured so they can give medical aid e.g. bandages!

Another exciting activity – hunting for miniature Jesus figures hidden around the church followed by taking them home – Jesus is always with us.

The music was lovely, I returned home with a service sheet which my Zimbabwean Christian carer picked up and started singing the hymns (songs) which she knew very well! She was very interested in the service and now wants to come to Colton Church!

Very special thank you Pam, you excelled yourself and your enthusiastic team who tirelessly kept up with requests and questions. I left rejuvenated and happy (87 years)!

I trust the many children will recall this exciting occasion in church rather than "sit still, don't touch, be quiet and it won't last for much longer".

PS Everyone was invited to refreshments including a piece of Candlemas Cake, also created by Pam.

Activities and News

Last year the Council applied to Westmorland and Furness Council to have 20mph speed limits introduced in Greenodd and Penny Bridge. We have just heard the good news that these schemes will be taken forward next financial year. A full consultation will be undertaken within the next few months, and we expect that the new limits will be in place before the end of the financial year 2025/26.

We are also pleased report that the Parish Council, working with Greenodd Village Hall, has now installed and commissioned an emergency generator for the Hall. This is part of a plan to equip the Hall to allow it to be as an emergency community hub during any extreme weather or other emergency events.

The Council's Heritage Project is nearly complete. A team of some 60 volunteers have been working to capture the unique history of the area. The idea is to show a snapshot of the activities and life experiences of people in the past. The research has been focussed on Arrad Foot, Broughton Beck, Greenodd, Mansriggs, Newland, Penny Bridge, Plumpton, Rossie, and Spark Bridge. We also have had a team of 4 photographers ~ members of Furness U3A ~ who have been helping us, by taking photographs that support the research and show the beauty of our area.

All this will be presented on a new website that is in the final stages of development. We will be launching it around Easter time.

Torver Parish Council held an extraordinary meeting on Thursday 30th January with ten members of the public and Deb Cook, Head of the Priestley Centre, who was present to provide a background to the Centre's application to construct six self-contained glamping pods with the retention of the existing yurt, and to respond to questions. After a lengthy debate it was resolved that the parish council was not minded to object to the application but it acknowledged that the public had raised a number of concerns which should be brought to the attention of the LDNPA. Also, after a brief debate about the application from The Wilson Arms (four timber Shepherd's Huts for holiday accommodation - variation of conditions 2, 3, 6 & 8 on planning permission), councillors resolved to support the application.

Following the notices about the uncertain future of the Coniston Medical Practice, Chair Peter Worth wrote to Coniston Parish Council and the Patients Participation Group to offer TPC's support.

TPC is scheduled to meet next on **Thursday 6th March** at 7.30pm in the Schoolroom.
