Pastoral Letter - Harry Welch

Dear friends,

A politician was asked if he was going to swear to tell the truth when testifying during an upcoming public inquiry. He replied, "Yes, I will swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing like the truth". Hopefully this was an attempt at humour. However, truth can be elusive. A search on YouTube will reveal no end of news broadcasting organisations each with their own bias, declared or not, and this in addition to the mainstream newscasters in print and online such as the BBC or commercial TV stations. This is not an issue that taxes only our own generation.

Blaise Pascal had a Christian conversion experience so profound he recorded it and kept the paper with him at all times. He was a 17th century mathematician, physicist, inventor, philosopher and Christian writer. Pascal also had difficulty discerning truth when it came to science and faith. He came to the conclusion that there are two forms of truth.

First, God's Truth, Revelation, which when discerned will be seen to be not just for the moment but reaches back to the beginning of time and forward to the end of time. The Old Testament prophecies are such. Nothing could be taken away from, or added to such truth.

Pascal contrasted this truth with scientific discovery which some of his peers claimed to be truth. Scientific truth, when discovered, is transient. It is at best work in progress with successive scientists adding too or taking away elements of the discovery.

Azer Bestavros was an 20th century Egyptian Christian scholar, lawyer and teacher. Like Pascal he wanted to live a true Christian life and pointed out some of the errors those enquiring after the faith may come across. He warned people to be wary of false evidences of the Christian faith in the lives of those who claim to follow Jesus Christ. He proclaimed three 'Bewares':

1. *Beware of Artificial Piety*, by this he meant shallow holiness, an outward exhibition of religion but no depth, no sign of God's presence in their life. Jesus condemned such deception;
2. *Heartless Knowledge*, using shallow evidences of faith to condemn others rather than raise them up to Christ. Jesus revealed such empty tombs;
3. *Dogmatic Religiosity*, this shows itself by arguing the faith in such a way as to put off those seeking God. Such people rest on what they know and block out revelation from God.

In these three traits we have evidence of those who have religion rather than faith.

How do we avoid such traps? Stay close to the Master, listen to the world with body, mind and spirit, be open to receive Revelation from God Himself and test everything. Shun those who are religious, keep fellowship with those who display the love of God, whatever the circumstances, and in turn give the glory to Him.

Rev. Derek Tinsley

When the Rev. Derek Tinsley moved on from this Parish he is reputed to have said that he trusted we would continue to discover peace in this beautiful valley as he had experienced for 10 years from 1985-1995.

Alongside this peace Derek found happiness and friendship. So many people, sadly no longer with us, loved him. Elderly and young responded to his outgoing personality, not just in church, but in the wider community. He soon involved himself in local schools, partaking in a variety of activities, especially musical ones.

I'm reliably informed that he had various organs all over the vicarage and could often be heard playing the church organ on an evening. He was always in demand for weddings and concerts. He was proud to play for his younger daughter Ruth on her wedding day in Rusland Church.

Colton Victorian Vicarage doors were rarely closed. He and his wife Hilary welcomed everyone whatever their faith, extending this welcome to newcomers. Annual garden parties were joyous, memorable occasions for the valley. They are frequently referred to even today. The house and garden were open. There were teas on the lawn, innovative games for children, music, camaraderie, everything a village fair should be! The Tinsley's also hosted Christmas activities for us all, music a highlight.

Our vicar was a man of many interests - including, antique organs and ancient church music. Derek travelled far to visit those in hospital. He will be talked about for years to come having supported many through the storms of life as well as sharing celebrations. The few of us left will keep his memory alive. We remember and miss him and thank him for contributing to our community, not forgetting his second in command, Hilary.

Tackling storm damage Storm Amy caused localised flooding, fallen trees and branches and surface damage on some lanes. We have reported the issues that we have been made aware of to the Westmorland & Furness Highways Team and hope that the repairs will be carried out soon.



Steps you can take:

You can report problems, including flooding, potholes, fallen trees and damage to the road surface and by phoning the Council on 0300 373 3300 or using this link <https://www.westmorlandandfurness.gov.uk/parking-streets-and-transport/streets-roads-and-pavements>

If a drain needs clearing or the verges require work, you can contact the Parish Council clerk@coltonparishcouncil.org.uk and we will assess if the job is something Archie, our Parish Lengthsman, can do. If road repairs are required, or the location is

not a safe place for Archie to work, we will refer the problem to the Council's Highways Team.

Make sure you are 'Winter Ready'. For advice on preparing for winter, including how to report an empty grit bin, what to do in a winter emergency, such as storms, snow or flooding, and if you have any welfare concerns see <https://www.westmorlandandfurness.gov.uk/winterready>

TORVER PARISH COUNCIL

The next meeting of TPC is scheduled for **Thursday 6th November** at 7.30pm in the Schoolroom. Flood Risks will continue to be a focus. Rick Graham has provided a very useful and comprehensive assessment of where we are with respect to the source of the storm overflow and the current state of the drains which mitigate flooding in the village. Also, a representative from the Rivers Trust is willing to come to Torver to look at the various sources of flood water and give an opinion on practicalities. TPC remains one councillor short of its allotted five: anyone interested in joining the council should contact its Chair, Peter Worth. What is involved? – over the year, six meetings each of an hour's duration (7.30-8.30pm) in the Schoolroom.

Friends of the X112 bus group update

It is now eleven years on from when the Friends of the X112 was formed. Our formation has enabled Blueworks Taxis Ltd. to continue running local bus services between Barrow, Ulverston and Coniston linking many small rural communities who, in 2014, were faced with the possibility of all previous rural bus services being withdrawn.

Those eleven years have produced a quite unique partnership between the community and a local bus company. This has been backed up by funding provided by many, mostly Cumbria based, grant funding organisations and, in more recent years, Westmorland and Furness Council.

We do have a few younger members who work very hard but we desperately require two younger people (we were in our late 60's when we started!) to be officials on our committee to help with secretarial work and marketing.

If it is possible to spread that information around in the hope that someone might be interested to help we would be extremely grateful.

For the time being the 'Friends' will continue to operate for as long as we can but it clearly does rely on finding the funds to keep it going and that is the hard part!

CONISTON CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETY LTD

At this point in time, and analysing figures for the last five years, it looks as if it will be a good year in terms of money taken from sales, and possibly the best over that period. One week in August gave us a record sales figure. We still have no tenant for the top shop (No.5) but are close to completing a deal. The loss of the experience and expertise of Ken Ennion and Phil Davies has left the committee short of members. To compensate, the Committee has used Co-operatives UK to produce a new Rules of Governance that will introduce an asset lock and broaden access to the committee to allow employees to be fully involved. Also, to raise the level of professionalism in the management of our properties, we are working with Matthews Benjamin. The top shop has been unoccupied now for 21 months. That is a considerable loss of income. The maintenance of the aging properties is increasingly expensive. At considerable expense, all traces of asbestos were removed from the Top Shop (No.5 Yewdale Road), and before a new tenant moves in, the aim is to replace the large front windows. The LDNPA has told us that the building at No.3 has been nominated for its Local Heritage List. At the meeting of the Committee on the 18th of September, members were unanimous in favour of accepting the nomination.
